The Twelfth Labor follows a single day, October 15, 1949, filtered through the warped and damaged mind of an Idaho farm girl. Through her memories, dreams, and swirling language, we come to understand the price she and her family have paid for a little dignity, as they await the return of their long absent father, lost somewhere in the war, half a world away.

The 12 Labors of Hercules

- 1 Nemean Lion: Hercules wrestles and kills a tough-skinned lion
- 2 Lernaean Hydra: Hercules kills the multi-headed hydra
- 3 Ceryneian Hind: Hercules captures the deer beloved of Diana
- 4 Ermanthian Boar: Hercules kills the rampaging boar
- **5 Stables of Augeias:** Hercules cleans the disgusting stables
- 6 Stymphalian Birds: Hercules scares away the killer birds
- 7 Cretan Bull: Hercules wrestles with the terrible bull
- 8 Mares of Diomedes: Hercules disposes of the man-eating horses
- 9 **Hippolytes Girdle**: Hercules takes the girdle/belt from the Queen of the Amazons
- 10 Cattle of Geryon: Hercules herds a large group of cattle across the world
- 11 Apples of Hesperides: Hercules picks the golden apples of the gods
- **12 Capture of Cerberus**: Hercules drags the three-headed dog out of Hades

The Twelfth Labor was previously produced as a workshop at Columbia University in 2008; and later—again as a workshop—by the Des Moines Social Club in Des Moines, lowa in 2009.

THE PLAYWRIGHT

Leegrid Stevens (*Playwright, Director, & Artist-in-Residence 2011, 2012*) grew up in Spicewood, TX. He earned his B.F.A. from Southern Methodist University in Dallas, where he won the Rosenfeld Playwriting Award before moving to New York where he now resides.

His plays have been seen in downtown New York theatres such as HERE Arts Center, Lark Theatre, Ontological-Hysteric Theatre, Theatre for the New City, Altered Stages, and Spring Theatreworks' Dumbo space. His plays have also been produced in several theatres across the US as well as Europe and have been published by Playscripts, Brooklyn Publishers, Smith & Kraus, Stage Tribes, Theater-Verlag Desch Publishers, and by Martin Denton's Plays and Playwrights Anthology.

His work in New York earned him NY Theatre's distinction as one of their "People of the Year" for which Martin Denton, NY Theatre critic wrote, "Indisputably one of the smartest and most innovative young playwright/directors working in New York's Indie theatre scene."

He has been awarded multiple development grants from Lower Manhattan Cultural Council and his plays have been developed by The Lark Theatre, Nancy Weil New Play Search, and Spring Theatreworks in Brooklyn.

Leegrid is a member of Stages on the Sound, an educational theatre troupe dedicated to bringing theatre programming to schools in and around New York. He recently co-directed *Romeo and Juliet* cast with 6th, 7th, and 8th graders from Holy Trinity Middle School in Queens, NY.

He recently received his M.F.A. in Playwriting from Columbia University where he won the John Golden Playwriting Award while studying under Chuck Mee and Eduardo Machado, he was also mentored by the playwright, John Guare.

Gary Jaffe (Director) is a director, playwright, proud Austin native, and the Artistic Director of Tutto Theatre Company, his professional work includes: Spirits to Enforce† with Capital T Theatre (winner--2011 Outstanding Production of a Drama, Austin Critics' Table), and The Dudley's: A Family Gamet by Leegrid Stevens with Tutto Theatre Company (winner--eight 2011 B. Iden Payne Awards, including Outstanding Production and Director of a Comedy). Additional Austin work includes: The Alien Baby Play and his own play Love in Pine. He received his B.A. cum laude with Distinction in Theater Studies from Yale University in May 2010. At Yale, he directed the world premieres of Beautiful Little Fools by Tessa Leigh Williams and his own translation of Once Five Years Pass by Federico García Lorca. His work at Yale also included *Passion* by Stephen Sondheim, *The* Real Thing by Tom Stoppard, Ghosts by Henrik Ibsen, L'enfant et les sortilèges an opera by Maurice Ravel, and The Baltimore Waltz and The Long Christmas Ride Home both by Paula Vogel. He also served on the Executive Boards of the Yale Dramatic Association, Inc. and the Yale Drama Coalition. He was the 2010 recipient of the Richard B. Sewall Cup for outstanding scholarly achievement and creative promise. Upcoming with Tutto: Zeus in Therapy, a new theatrical experience based on the original poetry of Douglass Stott Parker.

Matthew F. Ervin (*Dramaturg*, *Lead Producer*) is a Central Texas native. Attending Southern Methodist University, he pursued undergraduate and graduate coursework in Anthropology (Archaeology), English, Medieval Studies, and Creative Writing—yes, he was there for more than the standard four. He also studied Performance Studies with Gretchen Smith, non-Shakespearean Elizabethan drama with the late Twinkie Lawhon, Chaucer and Malory with the inimitable Bonnie Wheeler, and everything in between with the brilliant Jeremy duQuesnay Adams and John Lewis. While at SMU, he was employed variously. He worked for the aforementioned Wheeler: editing copy, page designing, and typesetting for a journal on King Arthur (*Arthuriana*)—four years worth—and eleven volumes of a book series (published by St. Martin's Press). He served as editorial advisor to Susan Sentler of the Martha Graham Dance Ensemble and, currently, Technique Coordinator at the Laban Centre London on a wide-range of projects from dance reviews to program and rehearsal notes. He has also

worked for columnist, Lee Cullum and Matilda Louree, past Commissioner of the Texas Commission on the Arts. In the Austin theatre scene, he has been Lead Producer on Tutto Theatre Company's productions of *Ophelia*/†* by Dustin Wills, *Black Snow*/†* by Mikhail Bulgakov, *Murder Ballad, Murder Mystery*/†/°* by Elizabeth Doss, *I Witness*, and *The Dudleys!: A Family Game* by Leegrid Stevens. Altogether these productions have collected sixty-one nominations, garnered twenty-two awards, and appeared on nine annual 'Top' listings from local media. During the day he is Graduate Program Coordinator in the Physics Department at UT. In addition to fulfilling the role of Dramaturg and President of the Board of Directors for Tutto Theatre Company in his spare time, Matthew is a fiction writer who suffers from an advanced stage of bibliomania.

la Ensterä (Set Designer) has been designing sets and costumes for theatre and film since the mid-1990s, and has been a part of some 80 productions thus far. She has served as the Resident Production Designer for Pollyanna Theatre Company for the past ten years, and works continuously with such Austin powerhouse production companies such as Breaking String Theatre (Flying by Olga Mukhina, Uncle Vanya, Ghosts, and The Schooling Of Bento Bonchev). Some of her favorite projects have been with Paper Moon Repertory (The 21 Would-Be Lives of Phineas Hamm), Imagine That! Productions (Down The Drain), Hyde Park Theatre (The Aliens), and The Materiality of Impermanence (a dance performance by Sharon Marroquin).

Throughout the various productions, la has worked alongside notable directors such as Robert Faires, Ann Ciccolella, Judy Matetzschk-Campbell, Beth Burns, Ken Webster, and Graham Schmidt. She has been nominated for numerous design awards by the B. Iden Payne Awards Council, and has been the recipient of five of them. In 2011, *The Austin Chronicle* also named her one of the "Top Theatrical Wonders Of 2011" and her set for *Uncle Vanya* as one of the "Top 10 Delights of The Latter Half of 2011"...and she was just awarded the Austin Critics'Table Award for Scenic Design.

la lives in Austin with her spouse Stacy, son Elias, and five furry daughters.

Natalie George (Lighting Designer) is a designer, producer, and artist based in Austin, TX. After freelancing around Austin as a stage manager and working at the State Theater, she returned to her alma mater in 2005 to work as the Lighting Director of the Mary Moody Northen Theater, Lighting designs there include: Parade, Mid Summer, Cyrano de Bergerac, and Peer Gynt. While working locally and nationally Natalie's talents led her to designing lights, production managing, and producing new works. Notable works include Magic Flute, Biloxi Blues, Baal, Glank, Wake Up Your Weird, Heddatron, Kodachrome Christmas, and I Witness. Since 2005, she has been the resident lighting designer for the Nation Puppetry Conference at the Eugene O'Neill Theater Center in Connecticut. In 2009 she left the University to focus on Fusebox, where she is now employed as the Producing Director. When she can fit it in, Natalie enjoys producing new works by her favorite artists. Producing credits include the shortfilm, The Runner,

which was selected by the Austin Film Festival to be screened in 2011 and new plays *Sad, Sad, Sad* and *spacestation 1985*. Both plays were workshopped in Austin and New York. *spacestation 1985* will have its full premiere in Austin in September 2012 at The Off Center.

Benjamin Taylor Ridgway (Costume Designer) collaborated with Palindrome on their productions of At Home At the Zoo and Hedda Gabler. In Austin he has also designed Baal for Paper Chairs, and most recently for the band, The White Ghost Shivers. In New York he is the resident designer for Theatre East and has also worked with: The Acting Company, Shakespeare NYC, Weathervane Playhouse and Orange Hanky. Other design credits include Macbeth, A Midsummer Night's Dream, Jeffrey, The Full Monty, Annie Get Your Gun, HONK!, Thoroughly Modern Millie, Harvest, Eye of God, and Inherit the Wind.

Austin M. Rausch (*Hair & Makeup Designer*) has recently received his B.A. in Theatre Design with a concentration in Costume Design from St. Edward's University in Austin, Texas. He has designed costumes for *The Spitfire Grill* as well as *The Further Adventures of Hedda Gabler* at the Mary Moody Northen Theatre. His designs for *The Further Adventures of Hedda Gabler* have received two nominations for Best Costume Design from the Austin Critics' Table and the Austin Theatre Examiner Special & Technical Awards, as well as national recognition from USITT (The United States Institute for Theatre Technology) in their *Sightlines Magazine*. Additionally, his designs have won Best Costume Design and Best Overall Design for Theatre at the USITT SW Symposium in Stillwater, OK. Currently, he is designing costumes for the Mary Moody Northen Theatre's production of *Bus Stop*, opening in the fall; he is also working as a costume designer, costume crafts specialist, and make-up manager for the House of Torment in Austin. He hopes to attend graduate school for his M.F.A. in Costume Design next fall at Yale or Carnegie Mellon University.

Justin Cox (*Properties*). This is the debut of his work on the Tutto stage. Justin was last recognized in *The Austin Chronicle* and *The Austin American Statesman* for his period props in Austin Shakespeare's production of *Arcadia* earlier this year. He trained at the University of Oklahoma, though he tries not to say that aloud around these parts. In addition to his theatre involvement, he has worked in the film and television industry including special effects props design and set dress for The Discovery Channel, and a western entitled, *The Legend of Hell's Gate*, released nationwide in June by Lionsgate Entertainment.

K. Eliot Haynes (Video Designer & Sound Designer) is an award-winning designer and Technical Director from Austin. Some recent designs include: The Jungle, Frankenstein, and The Crapstall Street Boys (Trouble Puppet Theater); Switch Shift Go, Flush, and Everything Between (Ariel Dance Theater); Doubt: A Parable, RENT, and Red Hot Patriot (ZACH Theatre); The Spitfire Grill (Mary Moody Northen Theater); and The Becomings (Pop Works). This is his third show with Tutto Theatre Company including I Witness and The Dudleys!: A Family Game*.

Eliot is also the Technical Director of the annual Fusebox Festival and Assistant Technical Director at St. Edward's University. As always he is very happy to be working with this talented group of artists.

Toby Minor (*Fight Choreographer*) is an actor combatant, certified with the SAFD (Society of American Fight Directors) and received his B.A. training from NMSU. He also holds black belt level in BudoTaijutsu (Ninjitsu), which makes him a real-life Ninja.
