THE 39 STEPS From Page to Stage

The Thirty-Nine Steps is an adventure novel by the Scottish author John Buchan, first published in 1915. It is the first of five novels featuring Richard Hannay, an all-action hero with a stiff upper lip and a miraculous knack for getting himself out of sticky situations.

In 1935, Alfred Hitchcock directed a film version of *The 39 Steps*. Hitchcock's version was a very loose interpretation of Buchan's original story; adding a love interest and several new plot twists.

In 2005, Patrick Barlow wrote the stage adaptation, based on the original concept by Simon Corble and Nobby Dimon. The play's concept calls for the entirety of Hitchcock's 1935 film to be performed nearly verbatim onstage, but with a cast of four. One actor plays the hero, Richard Hannay, an actress plays the three women whom he has romantic entanglements with, and two other actors play every other character in the show.

The play won the Olivier Award for Best Comedy in 2007 and the What's On Stage Award for Best Comedy 2007. It won two Tony Awards on June 15, 2008 for Best Lighting Design and Best Sound Design.
