Director's Note

Generic Ensemble Company makes the invisible visible through bold, socially relevant, body-centered theatre. Until now, we have primarily done that through devised work--tackling oft-urgent political matters with collective discourse and resistance. Sometimes, we must intensify our direct engagement with the urgency and direness of our times. And sometimes, to be more effective in that engagement, we must shift our perspectives to seek respite, change, and fresh outlooks.

This is GenEnCo's first "well-made" play. It marks an attempted shift in perspective. From the first draft Daria shared with me, I was drawn to the language and story-telling of these two characters. Moreover, as a fellow Japanese American, I was interested in how gender and border-crossing intermeshed with quintessentially Japanese themes surrounding the infamous organized crime world of the Yakuza.

893 is a kind of realistic fantasy of a world few know but somehow parallels more familiar worlds. How great is it that as people of color we can fantasize about our world and others? Why not show Asian Americans embodying Asian martial arts? Sometimes the most inspiring acts are sparked by flicks of the wrist or a curl of the lip. Perhaps that can begin here.
