Who's Who

Toner (Producing Artistic Director) founded Austin Playhouse in 2000. Before that he was Producing Artistic Director of the State Theater Company/Live Oak Theatre for thirteen years. Prior to coming to Austin he was Associate Producer for the inaugural season of the Los Angeles Theatre Center, Associate Producer/Director of the Cincinnati Playhouse in the Park for three seasons, and he founded Theatre Center of Mississippi; the state's first Equity theatre. He has also produced and directed at New Stage Theatre, Bucks County Playhouse, Theatre Midland and Theatre Four in New York City. For Austin Playhouse he has produced and directed Other Desert Cities, The Game's Afoot, Born Yesterday, Boeing-Boeing, The Lion in Winter, Stop the World, Laughter on the 23rd Floor, The Importance of Being Earnest, The Trip to Bountiful, The 39 Steps, Jacques Brel...Paris, Misalliance, The Mousetrap. Frost/Nixon, Fantasticks, A Flea in Her Ear, Dancing at Lughnasa, Amadeus, A Funny Thing...Forum, Blithe Spirit, Stones in His Pockets, Les Liaisons Dangereuses, Don't Dress for Dinner, Inherit the Wind, The Threepenny Opera, Steel Magnolias, An Ideal Husband, The Night Hank Williams Died, The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas, The Odd Couple, House, A Man for All Seasons, The Mystery of Edwin Drood, Rumors, Enchanted April, Cat on a Hot Tin Roof, The Underpants, Kiss Me Kate, Private Lives, Travesties, The Dead Presidents' Club, Damn Yankees, A Christmas Carol, Copenhagen, The Man Who Came to Dinner, Blues in the Night, The Seagull, Arcadia, Mahalia, and Light Up the Sky. Lara Toner (Director and Set Designer) has directed A Room with a View (which she also adapted for the stage), A Christmas Carol, Picasso at the Lapin Agile, The Turn of the Screw, Age of Arousal, Heroes, It's a Wonderful Life, Dug Up, Women Who Steal, Moonlight and Magnolias, Garden, A Texas Romance, and co-directed Proof, Speed the Plow and Les Liaisons Dangereuses for Austin Playhouse. She recently directed Age of Arousal at Southwestern University. She is a member of the Austin Playhouse Acting Company where she has appeared in productions of Other Desert Cities, The Game's Afoot, Boeing-Boeing, Proof, The 39 Steps, Misalliance, Frost/Nixon, Dancing at Lughnasa, Blithe Spirit, Les Liaisons Dangereuses, Don't Dress for Dinner, An Ideal Husband, The Night Hank Williams Died, House and Garden, A Man for All Seasons, Enchanted April, Rumors, Travesties, The Underpants, The Seagull, and Arcadia. She has also appeared in productions for State Theatre Company, Hyde Park Theatre, Aunt Lulu Productions, and Austin Script Works, among others.

Buffy Manners (Costume Designer) Before getting involved in theatre, Ms Manners started designing costumes for Austin Ballet Theatre in the days when they performed at the Armadillo World Headquarters. She is also a regular designer for Tapestry Dance Company, and was nominated for a Critics' Table Award for their internationally acclaimed production of Souls of Our Feet. She has designed many ballets including full-length productions of Romeo and Juliet, Cinderella, The Sleeping Beauty and Nutcracker. Buffy Manners has designed close to ninety productions for Austin Playhouse and

Don Toner, the latest being Other Desert Cities, A Room With A View, and Boeing-Boeing. She has also designed Three Sisters, and Eurydice for Mary Moody Northen Theatre at St Edwards Odd Couple and House. He is currently University: Cherry Orchard and Ghosts for Breaking String Theatre; and Midsummer Night's Dream, Hamlet, Henry V. Richard III, The Rivals, and Romeo and Juliet, for Austin Shakespeare Festival. She has been nominated for several B.Iden Payne Awards for her work. She has also been nominated by Austin Critics' Table for her costume designs for An Ideal Husband, A Macbeth, The Merry Wives of Windsor, Henry V, and Mrs. Warren's Profession Last fall she was fortunate enough to be invited to design a production of Hamlet for Prague Shakespeare Festival at the National Theatre in Prague, Czech Republic, under the direction of Tina Packer.

Don Day (Lighting Designer) has been designing professionally for over 30 years winning both Austin Circle of Theatre and Austin Critics' Table awards for his work. Bryan Schneider (Sound Designer) designed sound for Austin Playhouse's A Room with a View. Theatre Collective, Austin Script Works, MMNT, Naughty Austin/Arts on Real, and Refraction Arts Project. He has also been appearing on Austin stages for over 17 years. Performances include Pageant, When Pigs Fly, Psycho Beach Party, and BatBov: The Musical (Arts on Real), as well as Grease, Laughter on the 23rd Floor, and Our Country's Good (Mary Moody Northen Theatre). He appeared in, as well as co-produced, recent productions of Jeffrey and Kidnapped by Craigslist.

Suzanne Balling (Mrs. Erlynne) Austin theater credits include Medea (Medea), Just Outside Redemption (Dianne Hardy-Garcia), Burn This (Anna), Twelfth Night (Olivia), Richard II (Queen Isabel), and The Imaginary Invalid (Toinette). Suzanne received a B. Her next project is The Happy Couple, a new play by James Venhaus, for Last Act Theatre Company.
