### Who's Who

Don Toner (Producing Artistic Director) founded Austin Playhouse in 2000. Before that he was Producing Artistic Director of the State Theater Company/Live Oak Theatre for thirteen years. Prior to coming to Austin he was Associate Producer for the inaugural season of the Los Angeles Theatre Center, Associate Producer/Director of the Cincinnati Playhouse in the Park for three seasons, and he founded Theatre Center of Mississippi; the state's first Equity theatre. He has also produced and directed at New Stage Theatre, Bucks County Playhouse, Theatre Midland and Theatre Four in New York City. For Austin Playhouse he has produced and directed The Game's Afoot, Born Yesterday, Boeing-Boeing, The Lion in Winter, Stop the World, Laughter on the 23rd Floor, The Importance of Being Earnest, The Trip to Bountiful, The 39 Steps, Jacques Brel...Paris, Misalliance, The Mousetrap, Frost/Nixon, The Fantasticks, A Flea in Her Ear, Dancing at Lughnasa, Amadeus, A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, Blithe Spirit, Stones in His Pockets, Les Liaisons Dangereuses, Don't Dress for Dinner, Inherit the Wind, The Threepenny Opera, Steel Magnolias, An Ideal Husband, The Night Hank Williams Died, The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas, The Odd Couple, House, A Man for All Seasons, The Mystery of Edwin Drood, Rumors, Enchanted April, Cat on a Hot Tin Roof, The Underpants, Kiss Me Kate, Private Lives, Travesties. The Dead Presidents' Club, Damn Yankees, A Christmas Carol, Copenhagen, The Man Who Came to Dinner, Blues in the Night, The Seagull, Arcadia, Mahalia, and Light Up the Sky. He has appeared in Austin Playhouse productions of Heroes, Afterplay and The Threepenny Opera.

Buffy Manners (Costume Designer)
Before getting involved in theatre, Ms
Manners started designing costumes for
Austin Ballet Theatre in the days when they
performed at the Armadillo World
Headquarters. She is also a regular designer
for Tapestry Dance Company, and was nom-

inated for a Critics' Table Award for their internationally acclaimed production of Souls of Our Feet. She has designed many ballets including full-length productions of Romeo and Juliet, Cinderella, The Sleeping Beauty and Nutcracker. Buffy Manners has designed close to ninety productions for Austin Playhouse and Don Toner, the latest being A Room With A View, and Boeing-Boeing. She has also designed Three Sisters, and Eurydice for Mary Moody Northen Theatre at St Edwards University: Cherry Orchard and Ghosts for Breaking String Theatre; and Midsummer Night's Dream, Hamlet, Henry V, Richard III, The Rivals, and Romeo and Juliet, for Austin Shakespeare Festival. She has been nominated for several B.Iden Payne Awards for her work. She has also been nominated by Austin Critics' Table for her costume designs for An Ideal Husband, A Macbeth, The Merry Wives of Windsor, Henry V, and Mrs. Warren's Profession Last fall she was fortunate enough to be invited to design a production of Hamlet for Prague Shakespeare Festival at the National Theatre in Prague, Czech Republic, under the direction of Tina Packer.

Don Day (Lighting Designer) has been designing professionally for over 30 years winning both Austin Circle of Theatre and Austin Critics' Table awards for his work. Don designed light for Austin Playhouse productions of The Game's Afoot, Born Yesterday, A Room with a View, Boeing-Boeing, The Lion in Winter, Stop the World, Laughter on the 23rd Floor, The Importance of Being Earnest, The Trip to Bountiful, The 39 Steps, Jacques Brel...Paris, Picasso at the Lapin Agile, Misalliance, A Christmas Carol, The Turn of the Screw, Frost/Nixon, The Fantasticks, A Flea in Her Ear, Age of Arousal, Dancing at Lughnasa, It's a Wonderful Life, Sylvia, Dug Up, Amadeus, A Funny...Forum, Blithe Spirit, Speed the Plow, Les Liaisons Dangereuses, Stones in His Pockets, Don't Dress for Dinner, Inherit the Wind, Exits and Entrances, Women Who Steal, The Threepenny Opera, An Ideal

Husband, The Night Hank Williams Died, The Dead Presidents' Club, The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas, The Odd Couple and House. He is currently working with students as Technical Director at Southwestern University in Georgetown. Don holds an MFA from the University Of Texas.

The Gunn Brothers (Sound Designers) Gordon and Jimy have been recognized many times over with B. Iden Payne and Critics' Table awards and nominations. They have worked with most of the theatres in Austin; they were the sound designers in residence at Capital City Playhouse for the majority of its run, and they worked on some 20 shows at the State Theatre. Previous shows with Austin Playhouse include The Game's Afoot, Born Yesterday, Boeing-Boeing, The Lion in Winter, Laughter on the 23rd Floor, The Importance of Being Earnest, The Trip to Bountiful, The 39 Steps, Misalliance, The Mousetrap, Frost/Nixon, A Flea in Her Ear, Dancing at Lughnasa, It's a Wonderful Life, Sylvia, Dug Up, Amadeus, Speed the Plow, Blithe Spirit, Women Who Steal, Moonlight and Magnolias, Steel Magnolias, The Kingfish, The Night Hank Williams Died, The Man Who Came to Dinner. The Merry Wives of Windsor, Copenhagen, The Seagull, Blues in the Night, and Arcadia.

Patrick & Holly Crowley (Production Management, Set and Properties Design) Patrick has been a part of the Austin theatrical community since the late 70's. He has worked as a Technical Director, Master Carpenter, Lead Rigger, Designer, Director, Actor, and Master of the Custodial Arts for numerous companies across the United States. He is currently acting as the Artistic Director for The Aurora Arts Theatre in Corpus Christi. Holly has been seen in many houses across the country wearing many different hats and tool belts. She has worked for Fort Worth Opera, Maine State Music Theatre, Casa Manana, The Aurora Arts Theatre, and others where she has performed as Ulla in The Producers, Fraulein Kost in Cabaret, Set Designer, Production Manager, Scenic Artist, and many other wonderful roles within this magical theatrical world. She is currently acting as Production Manager for her own company, Dynamic Duo Productions, where she and Patrick build and design together.

Babs George (Polly Wyeth) is a member of the Austin Playhouse Acting Company and has appeared in The Lion in Winter, Age of Arousal, Dancing at Lughnasa, Les Liaisons Dangereuses, Women Who Steal, Steel Magnolias, House and Garden, Light Up the Sky, Private Lives and The Merry Wives of Windsor. She directed Afterplay and The Kingfish for Austin Playhouse. Babs has worked in regional theaters across the country, and played Lady Macbeth in Scotland at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival. Other Austin theatres where she has performed are: St. Edwards' Mary Moody Northen Theatre, Austin Shakespeare Festival, Breaking String Theater, Palindrome Theatre, Penfold Theatre, The State Theatre Company, TexArts, and Zachary Scott Theatre. She completed her M.F.A. in Classical Acting at The Shakespeare Theatre and George Washington University and is currently teaching acting at Texas State University as well as in the school she originated, the State Theatre School of Acting, (now in association with Austin Community College). She has also taught in the theatre departments at Southwestern University, St. Edwards and The University of Texas. The past two years she has won B. Iden Payne Awards for Best Actress in a Drama for "Martha" in Virginia Woolf and Kate Keller in Arthur Miller's All My Sons. She has been a member of AEA and SAG for over 30 years.

Bernadette Nason (Silda Grauman) is a member of the Austin Playhouse Acting Company. She has appeared in Austin Playhouse productions of Boeing, Boeing, The Importance of Being Earnest, A Christmas Carol, Misalliance, Sylvia, A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, Blithe Spirit, The Threepenny Opera, Steel Magnolias, The Odd Couple,

An Ideal Husband, The Underpants, The Merry Wives of Windsor and The Man who Came to Dinner. In Austin, she has worked with St. Edward's University Mary Moody Northen Theatre, Palindrome Theatre, Breaking String Theatre, Austin Shakespeare Festival, State Theatre Company., and ONSTAGE Theatre Co., among many others. She has received multiple nominations and awards including the 2007 Critics' Table Special Citation, "The John Bustin Award for Conspicuous Versatility." She is also a professional touring storyteller (www.bernadettenason.com) writing and producing solo fringe presentations, and appearing in schools, libraries and festivals nationwide.

Rick Roemer (Lyman Wyeth) is a member of the Austin Playhouse Acting Company and has appeared in The Mystery of Edwin Drood, Exits and Entrances, Jacques Brel, Amadeus, The Importance of Being Earnest, and Stop the World I Want to Get Off. At Zach Theatre, Rick played Danny/Zeus in Xanadu and will appear as The Albert's in the world premiere of Steven Dietz's play Mad Hip Beat and Gone. With Austin Shakespeare, Rick performed in Twelfth Night, A Midsummer Night's Dream and Richard III, and at the State Theater he performed in A Christmas Carol for two seasons. At UT Austin, he performed in the world premiere of Robert Schenkkan's The Marriage of Miss Hollywood and King Neptune, and at SU, Rick played Alfie Byrne in A Man of No Importance. In addition Rick is a professor of theatre at the Sarofim School of Fine Arts at Southwestern University in Georgetown where he has directed many productions including Godspell, The Cherry Orchard, Dames At Sea, Cabaret, Le Bourgeois Avant-Garde, The Glass Menagerie, Company, The Rocky Horror Show and Urinetown. For the past five years Rick has been acting and directing at the Rhodopi Drama Theatre in Smolyan, Bulgaria as part of the Rhodopi International Theatre Laboratory. At the laboratory, he cowrote, developed and directed a Theatre For Young Audience production called

Extremely Important Stories or The Truth About Spiders and also Rick directed the all Bulgarian premiere production of Durang, Durang at the Rhodopi Drama Theatre. Rick received his Ph.D. in Theatre History. Theory & Criticism from UCLA and is the author of Charles Ludlam and the Ridiculous Theatrical Company.

A graduate from St. Edwards University he appeared on the Mary Moody Northen Stage in various productions including Peer Gynt, Cloud 9, and Parade. Other credits include Sweeney Todd and Bat Boy with SummerStock Austin, DayboyNightgirl with DA!, Jubilee with Rubber Repertory, Hillcountry Underbelly with Paper Chairs, and Flying with Breaking String.
