

About the Playwright

PLAYVVRIGHT GREG PIERCE

... writes plays and fiction. He grew up in Shelburne, Vermont and now lives in New York City. His play Slowgirl was the inaugural play of Lincoln Center's Claire Tow Theater (LCT3). Upcoming productions include Steppenwolf Theatre this July/August. The Landing, a musical written with composer John Kander, will be produced by the Vineyard Theatre in NYC next season. The Wind-Up Bird Chronicle, co-written with director Stephen Earnhart, based on the novel by Haruki Murakami, premiered at the Edinburgh International Festival, and went on to play the Singapore Arts Festival.

Greg has received fellowships from the Edward F. Albee Foundation, The Dierassi Institute, the New York Public Library, and the Baryshnikov Arts Center. He currently holds a commission from Licoln Center Theater. His work has been produced/developed with Manhattan Theatre Club, Second Stage Theatre, Naked Angels, The New Group, The Public Theater's Under the Radar festival, the Vineyard Theatre, Asia Society, the Rattlestick Theater, the Great Plains Theatre Conference, 3-Legged Dog, and Out North/ Anchorage. Other plays include Odyssey Room, Kick Stop, and Kid Victory (with John Kander). His stories have appeared in literary magazines such as New England Review, Avery, Berkeley Fiction Review, Confrontation, and Conjunctions. For years, he wrote and performed with a theater group called The Bad Astronauts. His verses to accompany Camille Saint-Saens's Carnival of the Animals (written with Brian Hargrove) were performed at the Hollywood Bowl with the L.A. Philharmonic. He's recently been commissioned (along with composer Gregory Spears) to write an opera based on Thomas Mallon's novel Fellow Travelers, to be directed by Kevin Newbury. Slowgirl is published by Dramatists Play Service. He has a B.A. from Oberlin College and an M.F.A. in Creative Writing from Warren Wilson College. He is a member of the Dramatists Guild. His work is represented by William Morris Endeavor (Scott Chaloff for plays; Claudia Ballard for fiction). He plays some ping-pong.

COSTUME DESIGN GLENDA BARNES

... has designed shows that played on the Hyde Park Theatre stage, but this is her first time to work with Ken Webster on an HPT-produced show. She received her BFA in Costume Design at Texas State University and considers herself a homegrown Texan. She has designed for production companies like Summer Stock Austin, Capital T, Penfold, Doctuh Mistah, Cambiare, Breaking String, Austin Playhouse and Texas State University. She received a B. Iden Payne nomination in costume design for SSA's production of *Urinetown* and a B. Iden Payne Award last year for Doctuh Mistah's production of *Bloody, Bloody Andrew Jackson*. Her next upcoming project is *Don Giovanni* for Texas State University in April.

ASSISTANT DIRECTOR TROY CORMIER

...also worked as A.D. on HPT's Middletown. Tigers Be Still and The Aliens. He holds a B.A. in Radio/TV/Film from Sam Houston State University. Among his favorite of productions he has worked on are The Colored Museum, Ain't Nothing Wrong with a Gizzard Sandwich, The Misanthrope, Balkin', If Beds Could Talk, and Houston Grand Opera's Don Carlo.

LIGHT DESIGN DON DAY

... has an MFA from UT and works in theatres throughout Austin. Some of the more recent shows he designed for HPT are *The Lonesome* West; Dog Sees God; Blackbird; House; The Collection; The Atheist; Body Awareness; Circle Mirror Transformation; Vigil; A Behanding in Spokane; The Good Thief; Marion Bridge; The Aliens, Tigers Be Still, and Middletown. Don has received four B. Iden Payne awards and a Critics' Table Award for his design work.

ASSISTANT DIRECTOR HILDRETH ENGLAND

... has been spinning plates in theater, dance, film, commercial, and voice work in Austin since 2000, including as a Co-Artistic Director with the award-winning theater collaborative The Bedlam Faction. Recent theater credits include performances in Boeing Boeing and Stop the World the World, I want to Get Off (Austin Playhouse), in the site-specific movement piece The Man Who Planted Trees (Exchange Artists), in the world premiere of Paul Menzer's Brats of Clarence (Bedlam Faction), and as Molly Sloan in the touring company of the live-action graphic novel, The Intergalactic Nemesis (Jason Neulander & Robot Planet). When she's not stoking her creative flame, she helps mamas and babies develop healthy habits with Texas WIC. She's, like, totally excited to work with Ken, Molly and the HPT team on this awesome production and is, like, so grateful to Mical Trejo. She'd totally go out with him, like, to-night.

ABOUT SET DESIGN IA ENSTERÄ

THE ... originally from Finland, is an award-winning scenic and costume

CAST designer whose work in the past 18 years has been for both stage AND and screen. She is the Resident Production Designer for Pollyanna CREW Theatre Company, with whom she has been for the past ten years OF (including such shows as Tempest, Just Bee, Pattern Nation series, Ducks vs. Squirrels, etc). She recently designed Middletown and The Aliens for Slowgirl HPT, and has worked with Breaking String Theatre (Flying, Uncle Vanya, Ghosts, The Schooling Of Bento Bonchev), Austin Shakespeare (Arcadia), Paper Moon Repertory (The 21 Would-Be Lives Of Phineas Hamm), and some 70+ other productions. Some of her film work can be seen in The Two Bobs, The King, Idiocracy, The Ringer, Man From Orlando, and The Association. She has been nominated for guite a few B. Iden Payne Awards, and has been the lucky recipient of five of them, and is always on the hunt for the next project.

SOUND DESIGN ROBERT FISHER

... has worked independently as a live theatrical sound designer and composer for the past sixteen years. He has been nominated numerous times for his work by ACOT and the Austin Critics' Table. Robert runs his own company, Audio Art & Science, which provides audio services to video games, film, and television projects. He has lent his talents to projects by companies such as Sony Online Entertainment/Warner Bros/DC Comics, King's Isle Entertainment, EA Games, and Midway Games. His work has been aired on Cartoon Network. Robert is also a Producer with Bayou Radio Productions which premiered its first feature. Holy Hell, at the 2009 Austin Film Festival.

BECKY MOLLY KARRASCH

... is a Hyde Park Theatre Core Company Member and played Sherry in Tigers Be Still for HPT last spring. She was most recently seen as Boy in Martial Arts with Breaking String Theatre and as Aggie in The Game's Afoot with Austin Playhouse. Other Austin credits include Nan in Capital T Theatre's Exit, Pursued by a Bear for which she won the B. Iden Payne Award for Outstanding Lead Actress in a Comedy; Educating Rita (Rita - Sidetrack Productions); and Love's Labours Lost (Moth/Mercade - Austin Shakespeare). Her many roles with Austin Playhouse, where she is a company member, include Proof (Catherine), The Mousetrap (Mollie), It's a Wonderful Life: A Live Radio Play (Mary/Sally), Inherit the Wind (Rachel), Steel Magnolias (Annelle), and The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas. Molly has a BFA in Theatre from Stephens College in Columbia, Missouri.

ABOUT THE CAST AND CREW OF

STAGE MANAGER JOSH SINGLETON

... is Hyde Park Theatre's Technical Director and has had set construction credits on many HPT shows, from *Middletown* to *The Aliens* to *A Behanding in Spokane*. He also designed the set for HPT's production of *The Good Thief*. He frequently works with Capital T Theatre, including running the light board for *A Lie of the Mind*.

DIRECTOR, STERLING KEN WEBSTER

... is the artistic director of HPT. Most recently, he directed Middletown, Tigers Be Still and The Aliens, for which he won Outstanding Director at the 2012 Austin Critics' Table Awards. He also directed and performed in The Good Thief, A Behanding in Spokane, St. Nicholas, Vigil, Circle Mirror Transformation, and The Collection, and directed Marion Bridge, Body Awareness, and The Atheist for HPT. In 2010, he was named Outstanding Director by the Austin Theatre Examiner and received Austin Critics' Table nominations for directing The Atheist and The Collection. Webster was also voted Best Theatre Director in the 2010 and 2012 Austin Chronicle Readers' Polls. His film and television credits include Waking Life, A Scanner Darkly, an episode of Friday Night Lights, and the Emmy-winning HBO film Temple Grandin. In total, Webster has been nominated for 46 B. Iden Payne Awards and 23 Critics' Table Awards for acting, directing, and producing. In 2006, the Austin Critics' Table inducted Webster into the Austin Arts Hall of Fame.

PROP DESIGN DAWN YOUNGS

.... is a theater and visual artist originally from Cleveland, OH. She has her BA in theater from American University in DC and her MFA in Acting from the University of Missouri in Kansas City. Since fleeing to Texas, Dawn and her partner have been working at developing their property, Spooky Action Ranch, into an off-grid sustainable retreat for artists and creatives. You can see her regularly on stage at The Dionysium, and she is delighted to be working with HPT.
