#### BIOS

Bonnie Cullum (Producing Artistic Director) has created and presented over 300 innovative productions for VORTEX Repertory Company and has been inducted into the Austin Arts Hall of Fame. Her artistic work includes musicals, operas, plays, ritual theatre, and performance art for which she has received more than 100 awards. She earned an M.F.A. in Directing (University of Texas) and a B.A. in Theatre (University of Kansas). Cullum has directed more than 60 world premieres as well as dozens of published works. She teaches theatre, acting, directing, and ritual internationally with workshops and classes in Germany, Canada, and around the US. Thrice honored as Austin's Best Director by the Austin Chronicle, Cullum has been nominated for dozens of outstanding directing awards and received B. Iden Payne Awards for Best Director for Troades: The Legend of the Women of Troy, Moby Dick, and Despair's Book of Dreams and the Sometimes Radio. She founded the Summer Youth Theatre in 1991 to provide theatre opportunities for youth. Cullum is internationally recognized for her experimental productions and her advocacy of cutting-edge artists.

Jennifer Coy (Voice of Mandy) VORTEX COMPANY MEMBER: Sing Muse, Lear, The Elementals: Air, Sleeping Beauty, Oceana, The Secret Lives of the InBetweeners. REGIONAL THEATRE: University of Texas New Theatre, City Theatre, The Georgetown Palace, NXNW Theatre Company, Purple Crayon Rep, Shakespeare at Winedale. ACCOLADES: Three-time B. Iden Payne award nominee for outstanding comedy and musical performances.

Trey Deason (Rupert) was last seen just a few weeks ago on the VORTEX stage in *Cyberfest*. Other VORTEX credits include *Lear* (Oswald) and *The Secret Lives of the Inbetweeners* (Waldo - BIP nomination for Best Featured Actor.) Other recent acting credits include *The 12th Labor* (Tutto Theatre), *Midsummer in Motion* (Austin Bike Zoo), and *The Time Machine* (Sky Candy). As a playwright, he has had many short plays produced around town as well as two full-length works: *Human Sketches* (Sam Bass Community Theatre) and *Cardigan* (Purple Crayon-BIP nomination Best Original Script). Bridget Farr (Claire) left the freezing temperatures of Montana in 2010 to enjoy the opportunities and sweltering heat of Austin. She graduated with degrees in drama and linguistics from the University of Montana and continues that combination of interests by working as both a professional actor and a teacher of English as Second Language. Bridget is represented by Heyman Talent (South Central), and is also a producer at the Exchange Artists, an Austin based theater company. Recent acting credits include: "The Actress" in the horror film Found Footage 3D, "Girl" in Last Act Theater Co.'s Love in Pine, and "Serendipity 5054" in Ace Hardware's Soul Paint campaign. This is the first show in a year in which her character has a name, as well as her first time working with the VORTEX. It's been a stellar experience!

#### BIOS

Ann Marie Gordon (Scenic Design) has a BFA in Painting from the University of Texas and has been the resident scenic designer for VORTEX Repertory Company since 1997. She received 5 B. Iden Payne Awards for Outstanding Scenic Design for VORTEX's Sarah Silver Hands (NEA-funded), Sleeping Beauty (NEA-funded), St. Enid and the Black Hand, The Deluge, and Despair's Book of Dreams and the Sometimes Radio. She was recently nominated for B. Iden Payne awards for outstanding Scenic Design for Qualities of Starlight and WATER. She also designed the scenery for dozens of other world premiere VORTEX productions including Qualities of Starlight, EARTH, WATER, AIR, Oceana, Trickster, Vampyress, Wake for the Dark Poet, Dark Goddess, The X&Y Trilogy, and Elytra, as well as 13 years of Summer Youth Theatre productions.

Reina Hardy (Playwright) is a playwright from Chicago who recently fetched up in Texas. She's a Michener Fellow at UT Austin, a 2013 finalist for the Terrence McNally Prize, the recipient of the 2012 Interact 20/20 Commission, and a National New Play Network Playwright. Her plays, which usually contain magic and sometimes contain science. have been seen at Capital Stage Sacramento, Orlando Shakespeare, and the Great Plains Theatre Conference. where Reina was awarded the Holland New Voices Award. This summer, her play Glassheart premiered with the Shrewds at Salvage Vanguard. She spent part of this summer at the Kennedy Center, workshopping The Claire Play, which will appear at the NNPN National New Play Showcase this December. Her TYA play, Annie Jump and the Library of Heaven, will be produced as part of UTNT at UT Austin in February 2014. Reina will return to the VORTEX in Fall 2014 for Changelings a spectacle about family, fairies and theft.

**Tyler Mabry** (Sound Design) is a musician, songwriter, and composer. He is a member of the VORTEX Repertory company, and has contributed music to productions by Something for Nothing Theater, the vestige group, and others. As Resident Composer for Austin Children's Theater, he has composed music and songs for Jive, Kittyl, Shades of Gray, and Power Up!: Mayhem in Metroville.

Helen Parish (Prop Deisgn) is an artist who teaches high school art in order to support her theatre habit. She has worked on a number of shows at The VORTEX including Sleeping Beauty, Vampyress, AIR, Murder Ballad Murder Mystery, The Wife of Bath's Tale, EARTH, and Qualities of Starlight in addition to working with Summer Youth Theatre. Helen received a special B. Iden Payne award for her outstanding Prop Design in Qualities of Starlight. She is very grateful to Bonnie for all the creative opportunities and to her adorable new husband Michael for accepting her "once & occasional wife" role.

#### BIOS

Rudy Ramirez (Director) is an Associate Artistic Director of The VORTEX Repertory Company, for whom he has directed Sing Muse, Qualities of Starlight (Nominee: Best Director of a Comedy, B. Iden Payne Awards 2013), The Physicists (Best Director of a Show for Youth, BIP 2011) and Lear. He is also Performance Director for the Austin Bike Zoo, for whom he has created Midsummer in Motion (Nominee: Best Director of a Comedy, BIP 2012) and Wheels of Wonderland. Other directing credits include River City (with Lydia Nelson), Cardigan and Luna Tart Died. He is the writer of Promised Land: A Radical Queer Revival, Footnotes for People Who Don't Speak Spanish (with Beliza Torres Narvaez) and, as one of the writers of Sing Muse, is a nominee for Best Original Score, BIP 2013. He is very, very happy to be doing this play and to be making a home for Reina Hardy's work at The VORTEX. Thanks as always to Mom, Dad and the wonderful Bonnie Cullum.

Jennifer Rogers (Lighting Design) started in the theatre at 8 years old when big brother let her walk on the yellow brick road and she found that it led to the fascinating world backstage. She studied stage management at the University of Kansas with design focus in lighting. Jen is a partner in the design firm Light Bastard Amber (LBA). Jen has worked all over Austin as both a stage manager and designer with Teatro Vivo, The VORTEX, The Rude Mechanicals, Fusebox Festival, Leticia Rodriguez, Austin Summer Stock, and many others. Some of her favorite designs include: Sweeney Todd with Summer Stock Austin; Home Entertainment with Leticia Rodriguez; the B. Iden Payne nominated The North Project with Refraction Arts; Io: A Myth About You with Shrewd Productions; The Mariachi Girl and Cura with Teatro Vivo; and Patience with the Gilbert and Sullivan Society of Austin. Jen is a resident designer with the Fusebox Festival.

Breanna Stogner (Elaine) is a graduate of Texas State University with a Bachelor's of Fine Arts degree in Acting. She was last seen in Paper Moon Repertory's production of The 21 Would Be Lives of Phineas Hamm. Other productions include Down the Drain (Imagine That! Theatre), Psycho Beach Party (Arts on Real), I Love My Dead Gay Son: The Musical (Yellow Tape Construction Company), Parallel Lives (City Theatre), and Sexual Perversity in Chicago (Paladin Theatre Company). She is extremely excited to be in her first VORTEX show, and she is honored to be working with such a talented group of people on this production.
