W;t. What it means to be living.

Cancer. Is there any word in the English language that has such power. Maybe the word love, with all its connotations and permutations rivals cancer in its ability to rivet you and stop you in your tracks. But cancer is, in its singular state of meaning, stark and dreadful. Cancer can swoop into your life and everything changes. The devastation felt by families when a member is diagnosed with any form of cancer, the fear of losing your humanity in the face of the disease or the treatments available to combat it along with the seemingly reckless carelessness of the disease that strikes without warning or mercy, adds to cancer's fearful power. And yet, as *W*;*t* so eloquently shows, with the choices made in life indeed affecting how life ends, that our humanity is, in all its messy complexity, resolute and beyond cancer's stark and dreadful scope.

January 25th, 2001, my father died after receiving his second dose of an experimental chemotherapy treatment at M.D. Anderson Hospital for an increasingly less rare and extremely lethal form leukemia. He died as he lived, a doctor willing to give all to help others and to advance medical knowledge in the optimistic hope to someday find a cure for leukemia. I held his hand as he died. Life has never been the same for me or my family. Directing *W*;*t*, being a part of this production, has affirmed for me once again that life, as it is, is beautiful.
