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About the Playwright

PLAYWRIGHT ANNIE BAKER

..... grew up in Amherst, Massachusetts. Her full-length plays include Circle Mirror Transformation (Playwrights Horizons, OBIE Award for Best New American Play, Drama Desk nomination for Best Play), which was produced at HPT in 2010; The Aliens (Rattlestick Playwrights Theater, OBIE Award for Best New American Play); and Body Awareness (Atlantic Theater Company, Drama Desk and Outer Critics Circle nominations for Best Play/ Emerging Playwright), also produced at HPT in 2010. Her plays have been produced regionally by South Coast Rep, Guthrie Theater, Victory Gardens, Artists Rep, Huntington Theatre Company, Seattle Rep, Studio Theatre in DC, Hyde Park Theatre, Kansas City Rep, and San Francisco Playhouse, and have been produced internationally in London, Melbourne, Sydney, and Buenos Aires. She has developed work at Signature Theatre, MCC, New York Theatre Workshop, Soho Rep, Orchard Project, Ontological-Hysteric, Cape Cod Theatre Project, Bay Area Playwrights Festival and Sundance Institute Theatre Lab in Utah and Ucross, Wyoming. Annie is a member of New Dramatists, MCC's Playwrights Coalition and EST, and she is an alumna of Youngblood, Ars Nova's Play Group and the Soho Rep Writer/Director Lab. Recent honors include a New York Drama Critics Circle Award, a Susan Smith Blackburn Prize nomination, a Lilly Award, a Time Warner Storytelling Fellowship, a MacDowell fellowship and a Master Artist Residency at Atlantic Center for the Arts. A published anthology of her work, The Vermont Plays, was published by TCG in November 2011, and her adaptation of Uncle Vanya will have its world premiere at Soho Rep in June 2012. ... originally from Finland, is an award-winning scenic and costume designer whose work in the past 18 years has been for both stage and screen. She is the Resident Production Designer for Pollyanna Theatre Company, with whom she has been for the past ten years (including such shows as Tempest, Just Bee, Pattern Nation series, Ducks vs. Squirrels, etc). Some of her previous film work can be seen in The Two Bobs, The King, Idiocracy, The Ringer, Man From Orlando, and The Association. ... is a longtime HPT Core Company member whose recent acting credits include *The Atheist, The Collection* and *bombs in your mouth* (HPT) (Austin Critics Table nomination); *Static,* by Tom Horan, and *Watch the Gap,* choreographed by Ellen Bartel, both at the University of Texas; *Baal* (Paper Chairs); *Flying* (Breaking String); *Killer Joe* (Capital T Theatre); *Have You Ever Been Assassinated?* (Rude Mechs); *The Glory of Living, The Water Principle,* and *Blur* (HPT); and *The Collection* (Critics Table Award, Payne nomination) and *Bleacher Bums* (Payne nomination) for the Subterranean Theatre Company. Joey is originally from Hattiesburg, MS, where he attended the University of Southern Mississippi. He moved to Austin in 1997 and has loved every moment since.

COSTUME & SOUND DESIGN LEROY SAKOWITZ

.... was born in Port Arthur, Texas. The reclusive Mr. Sakowitz has collaborated with Ken Webster as a sound, set, and costume designer for over 30 years.

STAGE MANAGER DALLAS TATE

... is a theatrical jack-of-all-trades, working both on stage and off. Originally from South Carolina, Dallas came to Austin a year ago from New York City, where he lived after graduating with an MFA in Acting from Southern Miss. He looks forward to working for the Fusebox Festival this May.

DIRECTOR, KEN WEBSTER

... is the artistic director of HPT. Most recently, he directed and performed in The Good Thief, A Behanding in Spokane, St. Nicholas, Vigil, *Circle Mirror Transformation*, and The Collection, and directed Marion

Bridge, Body Awareness, and The Atheist for HPT. In Fall 2010, he was voted Best Theatre Director in the Austin Chronicle Reader's Poll. In January 2011, the Austin Theatre Examiner named him Outstanding Director of 2010. In June 2010, he received Austin Critics' Table nominations for directing The Atheist and The Collection. In 2008, he was named Outstanding Director of a Comedy at the Austin Circle of Theatre's B. Iden Payne Awards for Dog Sees God; he won the same award in 2007 for The Pillowman and was nominated for an Austin Critics' Table Award for directing The Pillowman and The Lonesome West. At the 2007 Austin Critics' Table Awards, he won Outstanding Lead Actor for his one-man performances in both St. Nicholas and Thom Pain (based on nothing). In total, Webster has been nominated for 46 B. Iden Payne Awards and 21 Critics' Table Awards for acting, directing, and producing. His film and television credits include Waking Life, A Scanner Darkly, an episode of Friday Night Lights, and the Emmy-winning HBO film Temple Grandin. In 2006, the Austin Critics' Table inducted Webster into the Austin Arts Hall of Fame.
