

Shock value is generally a tactic better left to comedy. However, when used in response to this concept we have of deceptive simplicity, this tendency we have to "humanize" by assuming that there are complicated, rational processes to undesirable actions, it's a puissant reminder that we in fact do not always know what we "know". The truly horrifying aspect of Bash is the way the characters' actions simply stride the line between logic and instinct. We're watching the aftermath, their equivocations and their explanations, but in the moment these people behaved the way they did with a crystalline primal clarity. Brrr. Enjoy.
