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

## About the Playwright

#### PLAYWRIGHT ANNIE BAKER

... was born in 1981 and grew up in the New England college town of Amherst, Massachusetts, where her mother was a professor. She has set four plays in the fictional college town of Shirley, Vermont. After graduating from the Department of Dramatic Writing at New York University's Tisch School of the Arts, Baker wrote Body Awareness as a member of the Ensemble Studio Theater's Youngblood, an emerging-playwright group. The play was staged by the Atlantic Theater Company in May and June 2008 and was nominated for a Drama Desk Award and an Outer Critics Circle Award. Later that same year, Baker was one of seven playwriting fellows at the Sundance Institute Theater Lab, where she workshopped her play Circle Mirror Transformation. That play went on to become an extended-run hit in New York last fall. Baker says, "Most naturalistic plays I see are a bunch of middle- or upper-middle-class people being witty. I don't actually find wittiness that funny.... . . . I think we are actually incredibly earnest and serious and kind of pathetic. That's funnier to me."
