### They live close by, the boys next door

Every day, everyone faces a set of challenges. Many those challenges revolve around work, money, and relationships, the typical things that make up most of our lives. For others, the challenges are things you and I take for granted every day. When we take time to see what is inside, we realize that deep down everyone wants the same things.

When we set out to direct this show our main objective was to give these characters, all of whom represent very real challenges faced by many, a voice and a chance to be understood. Having grown up with family members and friends with intellectual disabilities and mental health issues, both of us felt it was important to treat these characters with the utmost respect. One particular issue we faced was the use of a word that is now out of date and offensive, but is often used to describe those with intellectual disabilities. We both had serious reservations, however, in 1985 it would have been the correct term. We spoke with several people that work in special education and all assured us that this would be permissible considering the time that play was written. We have made a lot of progress, in this regard, since the 80's. We would like to express our gratitude to this cast of actors who have done an outstanding job with this show and their roles. It has been so rewarding to work with all of you. Thank you to our marvelous crew for their diligence behind the scenes. Finally, many thanks to Mr. Andy Berkovsky for all of his hard work and for giving us the opportunity to experience this beautiful show.
