DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Murder! Butchery! Blackmail! Robbery! Fraud!

These are words spoken by our title character summarizing the content of this often unsettling and thought-provoking play. Bertolt Brecht (1898-1956) transports us to 1930s Chicago to create, in his words, "A Gangster Spectacle." Set in the time of Al Capone and Baby Face Nelson, gangsters immortalized for their heinous deeds and sensationalized by the media, we are introduced to Arturo Ui, a two-bit gangster looking to earn respect and admiration in a tumultuous world infected by apathy and economic unrest.

Sound familiar?

The Resistible Rise of Arturo Ui uses an allegorical construct shadowing the turbulent rise to power of Adolf Hitler, drawing direct historical connections to key figures and significant events that aided in his command of Germany and its people. The original script even encourages the projection of chronological context at the end of each scene to further emphasize the historical parallels.

My interest in this piece is not in the cleverly disguised history it examines but the timely political and social relevance it exposes. I continue to be struck by the overt political parallels this play examines relevant to our contemporary circumstance. As we struggle as a nation to choose our next commander-in-chief, I am reminded that the danger of corruption and violence is often motivated by fear and ignorance. But it is the resistance to this witlessness that provides clarity of thought and decision. This is the lesson we are presented with and the consequential warning of repeating an ominous history.

Thank you for supporting the exceptional work we present here at the Mary Moody Northen Theatre, and enjoy the show.
