## A Note From The Director

I have always found myself drawn to stories that ask me to explore my beliefs, my connections with people both in and outside my sphere of influence, and how I relate to and interact with the world in general. This is reflected in my mission statement for my life as an artist: "Tell stories that challenge people to see the humanity in the strangers on the street and the people that they meet—encouraging communities to unify and rally together to uplift one another." By Our Hands fits this mission.

It is no secret that the major moments of our plot all revolve around a government that has taken all firearms away from its people, and a small group of those people who are trying to get the guns back to reclaim their freedom. As with any good sci-fi story we are tapping into a social anxiety plaguing our nation and, using a future setting and extreme circumstances, exploring this concept more in-depth. Whether it is the fear that people in power wish to strip us of our ability to stand up for ourselves, our families, and our freedoms, or the fear tied to the rampant mass shootings occurring in our nation and a desire to do something to quell them, we all experience this anxiety on some level.

I point all of this out to say... we aren't actually necessarily here to talk to you about guns. We are not ignoring the prevalence they hold within our story and if you look deep enough there is probably some commentary on gun regulation you can imbue our story with. This commentary will likely be determined by your own stance on this issue but at the end of the day this is not why we're here to tell this story. We are not here to tell you how to feel about guns.

In an interview I was asked what philosophy or worldview I was attempting to present to our audience and my answer was simply that while I have my ideas it is my belief this story stands strongest when the people consuming it are able to create their own ties to it. When our cast read the script for the first time I was pleased to discover they each had something different they took away from it. None of their interpretations were wrong. While I believe in authorial intent to a degree I also am a slight purporter of "Death of the Author." The longevity and impact of our story is only strengthened by its varying connections to different people.

Focus on your relationship with this story and not what you perceive to be the message myself and my team are trying to force on you. It is when you connect with this piece on your own that it will speak to you profoundly. All of that said, we hope you find yourself entertained tonight as well as in a state of reflection. The same reflection I was brought to many times while working on this production. Thank you for being here. Thank you for sharing art with us. Most of all thank you for listening.
