

DAVID STAHL (Deputy-General Danforth)



Morgan (1991), The Last Yankee (1993), and Broken Glass (1993), which won the Olivier Award for Best Play. Miller wrote an adaptation of The Crucible for the 1996 film version starring Daniel Day-Lewis and Winona Ryder, which garnered him an Academy Award nomination.

One of the leading American playwrights of the twentieth century, Miller's significant contribution to the American theatrical canon may be explored further through an enormous number of resources.

MICHELLE S.
