She also directed Age of Arousal at Southwestern University. Ayad Akhtar (playwright) was born in New York City and raised in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. He is the author of *American Dervish*, published in 25 languages worldwide and a 2012 Best

Book of the Year at Kirkus Reviews, Toronto's Globe and Mail, Shelf-Awareness, and O (Oprah) Magazine. He is also a playwright and screenwriter. His play DISGRACED played at New York's Lincoln Center Theater in 2012 and premiered at the Bush Theater in London in May 2013. Disgraced won the 2013 Pulitzer Prize for Drama. His play The Invisible Hand was nominated for the ATCA/Steinberg Award, and won Best New Work 2013 from the St. Louis Theater Critics Circle. As a screenwriter, he was nominated for an Independent Spirit Award for Best Screenplay for The War Within. He has received commissions from Lincoln Center and the Oregon Shakespeare Festival. He is a graduate of Brown and Columbia Universities with degrees in Theater and Film Directing.

Andrew Hatcher (Stage Manager) has worked either backstage, in the booth or had a cameo appearance in Austin Playhouse productions of The Philadelphia Story, Chicago, She Stoops to Conquer, Sherlock Holmes & the Case of the Jersey Lily, And Then There Were None, Chess and many other shows as the box office attendant. Other credits include numerous works with Salvage Vanguard Theater, Doctuh Mistuh Productions, Fusebox Festival, Texas Performing Arts, Breaking String Theater, OUTsider Fest and Mary Moody Northen Theatre. In recent years, he has diversified into the technical world as an audio engineer with clients including ZACH Theatre, SummerStock Austin, Doctuh Mistuh Productions, Austin Theatre Project, GSD&M, Austin Shakespeare, and Tapestry Dance.

Glenda Wolfe (Costume Designer) Glenda graduated from Texas State University with a BFA in Costume Design and Technology. This is her seventh production for Austin Playhouse, having previously designed The Norwegians, I'm Not Rappaport, Heroes, Frost/Nixon, The 39 Steps, Chess, and Triumph of Love. Other production companies she works with include Doctuh Mistuh, Penfold, Summer Stock Austin, Capital T and Texas State University. She received a B. Iden Payne award for her costume design of Bloody, Bloody, Andrew Jackson and a nomination for Urinetown. She also is the recipient of a Central Texas Excellence in Theatre Award for Triumph of Love. She teaches Costume Construction and Stage Makeup at Texas State University.

Crystal Bird Caviel (Jory) was recently on stage in *The Tree Play* for Robi Polgar at Groundfloor Theatre, *Getting Out* and *Beauty is the Best Priest* for ACC's Drama department. She was also seen as Emma Goldman in *Love*, *Anarchy, and Other Affairs, Have a Nice Day, Why Bother?* at City Theatre, and contributed to *Man Friends* for JuaniBeGood Productions. She will graduate this Spring from Texas State with a BFA in Performance. She is a passionate death penalty abolitionist working with the Coalition to End the

Death Penalty and strives to use art as a tool for social justice.

Harold Fisch (Abe) is an actor, filmmaker, photographer and collaborative artist based in Austin, Texas. He has appeared in large and independent film productions, including Greenbelt, Cabin Crew, Rearview Mirror, and HBO's The Leftovers. He has also been on stage for the original works of Tango Through the Revolution, Mommy, and The Loop. In 2014, Harold wrote, produced, and starred in Wartorn, a film that is currently in consideration at film festivals across the globe. In addition to acting, Harold works as a freelance photographer, producer and editor for films, businesses, entrepreneurs and artists. He is also the owner and founder of Resaca Media, an arts and media firm. Harold is a graduate of the University of Texas at Austin.

Molly Karrasch (Emily) is an Austin Playhouse Acting Company member. Austin Playhouse credits include Chicago, Time Stands Still, Roaring, Venus in Fur (Critics' Table Nomination), The Game's Afoot, Proof, Steel Magnolias, and The Mousetrap. Molly is also a company member at Hyde Park Theatre where she has appeared in Slowgirl (B. Iden Payne Award), Tragedy: A Tragedy, Tigers Be Still and works with Capital T Theatre as an actor (Exit, Pursued by a Bear, Fool for Love) and director (DNA).
