PREVIOUSLY IN THE DRAGONFLY PRINCESS

Qlye sends Princess Mala on a mission to discover the source of the disruption of the flow of white pearls that illuminate Ovovia and give the Ovo their longevity. She travels with her servant, Joji, on the back of the giant dragonfly, Xephyra, and they uncover many mysteries. During this life-threatening quest, they fall in love. After many adventures, they meet Vyn who has stopped the flow of white pearls and is now in possession of the Emerald Trident and the Black Pearl. Mala receives the powerful Green Pearl, and she is able to defeat Vyn. As she dies, Vyn reveals that they are really sisters. Mala returns home triumphantly to Ovovia.

IN THE 11 YEARS SINCE THE DRAGONFLY PRINCESS

Qlye reveals details of her military plans and secrets to Mala. They are able to reconcile as Mala assumes command of Ovovia. Queen Mala, with her lover, General Joji and her mother Qlye, wage war on all of the other Faery kingdoms. They engage in The Swarm, a military campaign against their last powerful enemy, The Iloli. The Swarm did not achieve the overwhelming victory that they desired, and they have now captured an Iloli White Shell Ship in order to penetrate Ilolian borders.

THE DRAGONFLY QUEEN

Synopsis

Mala and the Ovo celebrate the power of their kingdom on the White Shell Ship, commandeered from the Iloli. They torture and kill Captain Tokana. Mala reflects sadly upon her transformation into a Frigg (part Fae and part Dragonfly). Suddenly the Octax (a vampire squid Frigg) takes over the ship and paralyses the Ovo. The Octax reveals that the Great White Orca Centipede has split into two beings of light. Qlye uses the Green Pearl to defeat The Octax's hold on the Ovo, and Mala kills the Octax. They reach the shores of Ilolia and find it deserted. Ofio, the High Priest of the Iloli temple (also now a manta ray Frigg), comes on board and divulges the fate of the Iloli: Under Nyka's guidance, a weapon to defeat the Ovo accidentally incinerated the Iloli. Ofio reveals the Pink Pearl, and the Ovo are all seduced by its euphoric spell. Joji comes to her senses and uses the Green Pearl to break the Pink Pearl spell. Ofio pleads for his life and promises to take them to Orca Reef to find Nyka.

Intermission.

After a terrible storm, the White Shell Ship reaches Orca Reef. Nyka takes control of the ship, threatening and dismissing all of the Ovo except for Mala. Queen Kolee (now a sea dragon Frigg) arrives and discloses the consequences of the Pearl of Death and death of the King, Nyka engages Mala, Ofio, and Kolee in the Circle of the Three Pearls, but in the midst of it, Ofio and Kolee attack Mala. Using "Joji" as a word of power, Mala chokes and destroys them. A distant explosion reveals that Nyka has murdered Mala's companions. However, Joji and Qlye escaped and regain control of the White Shell Ship. Mala kills Nyka and collapses. Qlye heals Mala with the Green Pearl. The Great White Orca in the form of two Wing Sirens arrives and unites with Mala becoming the Dragonfly Goddess. (look for part three in a few years).


