Director's Notes

In the time that I have been directing plays, I have been struck by the disparate numbers of talented and dedicated women who audition for plays, and the dearth of interesting parts available for them. It seemed to me that the ladies of Austin theatre were an underused resource, so I set out to find scripts that would feature female artists. My search led me to this gem of a play. Early Girl is a story that takes place in a brothel, but which isn't about sex. Each of the women is distinctly drawn by the playwright and treated with respect. Early Girl is never about the lurid or sensationalistic aspects of prostitution, but instead is about how the women in the house relate to each other, and about the secret toll the profession takes on each of the employees. Focusing on the female performers of this city will be a priority of the Paladin Theatre Company.
