Fantasticks: A Flea in Her Ear, Dancing at Lughnasa, Amadeus, A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, Blithe Spirit, Stones in His Pockets, Les Liaisons Dangereuses, Don Y Dress for Dinner, Inherit the Wind, The Threepenny Opera, Steel Magnolias, An Ideal Husband, The Night Hank Williams Died, The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas.
