

WHO'S WHO

MOLLY KARRASCH (Rita) is a member of the Austin Playhouse Acting Company. She has appeared in their productions of *The Mousetrap, It's a Wonderful Life, A Funny...Forum, Inherit the Wind* as Rachel, *The Threepenny Opera, Steel Magnolias* as Annelle and *The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas*. She attended Stephens College in Missouri, where she earned her BFA in theatre. At Stephens she was seen in *Cabaret* (Sally Bowles), *Chicago* (Mona), *Anton in Show Business* (Holly), and several other shows. She spent a summer doing stock at Okoboji Summer Theatre and appeared as Electra in *Gypsy*, and *Cinderella*. Other credits include *Sophisticated Ladies, Into the Woods, A Little Night Music, Starmites*, and *Dear John*.

MICHAEL STUART (Director/Frank) is a member of the Austin Playhouse Acting Company. Austin Playhouse productions include Misalliance, The Mousetrap, Frost/Nixon, The Fantasticks, Heroes, It's a Wonderful Life: A Live Radio Play, A Funny...Forum, Stones in His Pockets, Inherit the Wind, The Threepenny Opera, Moonlight and Magnolias, An Ideal Husband, The Night Hank Williams Died, The Odd Couple, House and Garden, The Mystery of Edwin Drood, Rumors, Cat on a Hot Tin Roof, Kiss Me Kate, Travesties, and The Dead Presidents' Club. He directed their production of Sylvia and co-directed Speed the Plow. For more than ten years, Michael was the Artistic Director of OnStage Theatre Co. producing, directing, and acting in over forty productions including Harvey, Shirley Valentine, and Ten Little Indians here at Austin Playhouse.

CHRISTOPHER LOVELESS (Stage Manager) is a St. Edward's graduate. He has appeared in Austin Playhouse productions of Frost/Nixon, Amadeus, Inherit the Wind and The Merry Wives of Windsor (in conjunction with the Austin Shakespeare Festival), and stage managed The Turn of the Screw and Speed the Plow. Other plays include Hyde Park Theatre's portion of the Susan Lori Parks' project 365 Days, 365 Plays, the Texas premiere of Corpus Christi for Real Rain Productions, House of Yes and 9x9x9 for the Coda Theater Project, Romeo and Juliet, Titus Andronicus, and Henry V for Austin Shakespeare.
