DIRECTORS' NOTE

We've been working on this for a long time. The vision of taking a production of ours to Costa Rica has been in the works for several years and we've taken small steps to get to this point. But when we finally decided on EVITA as our production, things just started falling into place. It was the right show at the right time and we're so excited about this opportunity to take students from Austin to perform in a foreign nation. Not a lot of high schools can say that about their theatre program and it's something we are very proud of.

This production of EVITA you are watching tonight is not what you would see at any other theatre in town or even around the country. We've done a very special adaptation of the script to embed, fundamentally, the native language of the characters (Spanish) into what is typically a completely English libretto. The result, we hope, is exciting/different/challenging for the audience and the students making it come to life. We used the Madrid 1979 and Broadway 1978 scripts and interwove them. For those of you who don't speak both Spanish and English, there are supertitles to help bridge the gap. What you will find if, however, you do speak both languages is that what is unique about this adaptation is the fluidity of the Madrid script's translation and adaptation. It takes makes the musicality of the language its priority and therefore some of the lines are adapted instead of translated, often to much better effect than the original line.

Lots of factors go into picking a production for the Theatre at McCallum Fine Arts Academy. One of those this year has to do with the political atmosphere we've been in leading up to and since the election. The cult of personality criticism (for Obama and Palin), the culling of people's anger and sentiment into movements (Change/Hope and Tea Parties), and the reality that we've seen many times in recent memory of the rich and powerful still manipulating those beneath them (Bank Bailouts/Bernie Madoff) all come out in full color in this production. Additionally, as I'm writing this note, Costa Rica just elected its first female President and now our production will have an entirely new resonance when we take it there this summer.

Finally, this project will not happen without funding from you. It costs about \$2500 per student to take this production to Costa Rica. Over \$100,000 has to be raised in order to make this happen and we are depending on the generosity of you, your friends and family, and the greater Austin community to help us reach our goals. 





Where's Evita: The Wild and Crazy Story of Evita's Corpse

After Eva Peron died, a million people crowded the streets of Buenos Aires for her funeral procession, and her fans repeatedly petitioned the Pope to make her a saint. After her funeral, her body was taken to the headquarters of the Argentine Confederation of Labor while plans were made for a monument to her.

But, when the military overthrew Peron in 1955, they seized Eva's body so that Peronistas could not snatch it. However, the military could not find anyone who was willing to keep the corpse for fear of her supporters. The body was hidden in a plain box and parked in a truck on a downtown Buenos Aires street. Then, they marked the box "radio equipment" and put it in an army office. It disappeared in 1956. Ten years later Eva's body was found buried under a false name in an Italian cemetery. In 1971, Eva's body was turned over to the Peron family who were living in exile in Madrid. When Peron returned to power in 1973, he brought Evita's coffin home and put it on display in Buenos Aires. In 1976 it was moved to a family crypt in Recoleta Cemetery in Buenos Aires.
