

David Blackburn (Pianist) David studied music and theatre at the North Carolina School of the Arts and Appalachian State University. He began his professional career as music director of a summer stock production of *The Apple Tree* at the age of 16. Since then he has been music director for hundreds of musicals. Among his favorites are *Once on this Island, Ain't Misbehavin'*, *The World Goes 'Round* (The Music of Kander & Ebb), *Into the Woods, Evita, Pacific Overtures, A Chorus Line*, The Who's *Tommy*, *The Full Monty*, and *Sweeney Todd*. Mr. Blackburn is an accomplished pianist and has played with the national touring companies of *The Most Happy Fella*, *Guys and Dolls, and Victor/Victoria*. He has served as Music Director/Conductor for Royal Viking Cruise Line, Carnival Cruises, and American Hawaiian Cruises.

Mr. Blackburn has composed the scores for 18 original musicals.

Recently, he composed orchestrations for the award-winning playwright

Stephen Dolginoff's new musical Panic. He was commissioned by Weber

State University in Ogden, Utah, to write orchestrations for their new version of the musical, Sleepy Hollow.



### From Our Director



I have been talking about directing Fashion at SBCT for close to a decade. I should start this story by explaining that this is not my "first time at the rodeo" when it comes to this show. That fact, more than any other, is why it took me the last decade to get around to doing this show... I needed to line up the right creative team. I hold a very fond place in my theatrical heart for this show and my love affair with it goes all the way back to 1974 when I first saw it Off-Broadway at the McAlpine Rooftop Theatre during its original New York run.

Back in the days when the price of New York theatre didn't mean selling your first-born into slavery, I used to make annual trips to the Big Apple. I would have 1 or 2 shows already planned and purchased but everything else would be a spur of the moment decision based on what was available at the Times Square TKTS booth. That is how I came to see The Hot I Baltimore, the first show I directed here, and it's how I first came to see the show that you are seeing tonight. As I sat in the audience, I kept thinking that this was a perfect community theatre show. The next day, I went to the Drama Book Shop to see if it had been running long enough for a script to be published. Happily, it had and I took a copy back home with me to show to Phil Grecian as a suggestion for the upcoming season at the Playhouse In The Park. I even offered to design the set. He liked the script and scheduled it for the next season. I ended up not only designing the set but also playing the only male role in the show. It remains an experience that I remember as being more fun than an actor should be allowed to have. Fashion is not your average musical. Heck, it's not even your average evening in the theatre. Although it has many similar qualities to Dames At Sea and Little Mary Sunshine, both glorious spoofs of show business, it is its own unique animal. First off, it's a musical adaptation of an important piece of theatrical literature by the first American woman to achieve popular success as a playwright. Fashion was acclaimed by audiences and critics alike. Theatre historians mark it as one of the first successful efforts to create a distinctively American comedy of manners. Aside from that, however, this adaptation is a musical within a play. We are watching performers rehearse this new musical. So, right off the bat, everyone on stage is playing two different characters at the same time. Not average, Add in the backstage drama that boils to the front and the old adage of "the show must go on" and you

Over the last few years the fates began introducing me to the people who were the right creative team for this show. Eve Lerma created the choreography for All In The Timing and when she embraced my idea for that production's finale with glee, I knew I had found the choreographer. My vocal director, Heather Rosen, came to the project during Schoolhouse Rock thanks to Lynn Beaver and Tara Bonds. I realized that I would probably never get the planets to line up like this again, so when I asked, they all thankfully said yes. The show was then a go...

have the recipe for comedic mayhem.

Fashion is not an easy show to describe to people... the closest I've been able to come is that it is like Hello Dolly meets Noises Off. I sincerely hope that you are as royally entertained as I was 36 years

like to thank her mother for her love and support.




#### Eve Lerma (Choreographer) - Eve Tennessee Lerma,


