A funny thing about A Funny Thing

Comedy does not typically age well. One need only watch a two-weekold episode of *The Daily Show* and realize how many of the jokes are no longer funny. *A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum* is a happy exception to this rule. Written in 1962, *Forum* draws on the work of the ancient Roman playwright Plautus (254-184 BCE). Plautus' plays have been a model for many playwrights, including Shakespeare, whose *Comedy of Errors* is based on the *Menaechmi*. Plautus also inspired many genres of semi-improvised comedy, including Commedia dell'Arte, Vaudeville, and its decadent cousin burlesque (a medium in which many of *Forum*'s original cast began their careers). While it is politically incorrect in today's climate of cultural relativism to suggest that any work of art is "universal," you will nevertheless laugh tonight at the same jokes that tickled Roman audiences two centuries before the assassination of Caesar.

Written by a team of writers that included television legend Larry Gelbart, the script for *Forum* is strong enough to hold the stage even when performed with no music. Once the brilliant songs by Stephen Sondheim are added, *Forum* becomes a bona fide masterpiece. The challenge in staging such a work is to do justice to the fabulous material; and we are confident that our talented company is equal to this task.
