

#### Director's Note

In Good Things Susan, like the items for sale in the rummage shop where she volunteers, has been discarded from the life she previously knew. Out of a job and having lost her husband to a younger woman, she's also in danger of losing her relationship with her teenage daughter. Approaching middle age (some would say already firmly entrenched in it) Susan has to sort through the jumble of her life and figure out what are the good things that are worth keeping.

Through Susan's story, Liz Lochhead focuses us on the transience of so many of the good things in life, things that we hold dear one minute and the next minute are changed or gone altogether -- like a home we leave behind, a beloved parent, a child who grows independent of us, a romantic relationship. But good things lost become other good things gained - a different relationship with the child, a new friendship, a renewed sense of who we are and what we are capable of being.

I would like to thank the amazing cast and crew -- they have truly been my 'good things' during the process of discovering this play. Thanks especially to Lorella Loftus who invited me to be a part of this project and to Bonnie Cullum for her support and assistance. They have both been guiding lights throughout this process. And thanks to Jennie, she's not just a good thing, she's the best thing.

### **Production Biographies**

Andy Agne (Assistant Scenic Design) was born in Germany, trained as a chef, considers himself a jack of all trades. He works exclusively with The VORTEX as the Facilities Manager and also assists in building sets every chance he gets. VORTEX productions include *Troades*, *The Shocker*, and *Oceana*. He has an intense love for theatre with all of its facets and moods.

Adam Gunderson (Stage Manager) has been stage managing and running tech for shows at The VORTEX for 6 years. His credits include Holy Well and Sacred Flame, St. Enid and the Black Hand, Scarlet Letter, Ghost From a Perfect Place, Black Tower, 4:48 Psychosis, Beirut, Hamlet and The Beauty Queen of Leenane, and Summer Youth's productions of Wyrd Sisters, The Visit and Vitriol and Violets.

Lorella Loftus (Susan) Originally from Glasgow, Scotland, Lorella founded Renaissance in 2002 and has produced or co-produced and directed numerous productions for Renaissance, VORTEX Repertory Company, Austin Celtic Festival and Celtic Cultural Center. She has also worked with Zach Scott, Rude Mechanicals, Austin Shakespeare Festival and City Theatre. Most notably she directed Liz Lochhead's *Medea* and William Shakespeare's *Coriolanus* for VORTEX.

Lorella was last seen as Maureen in Renaissance/ VORTEX's production of Martin McDonagh's *The Beauty Queen of Leenane* (B. Iden Payne award for Most Outstanding Cast). She is looking forward to performing Shekhar Govind's adaptation of *The Wife* of *Bath's Tale* in 2010.

Angela Loftus (Scotch Doris, Marjorie, Natalie, Sharp Young Policewoman, Helena) is making her second appearance at The VORTEX, after playing The Fool in Summer Youth Theatre's Wyrd Sisters. She performed in Renaissance's MacBeth at the Dougherty Arts Center, the Austin Celtic Festival, and most recently, in Little Shop of Horrors at Lake Travis High School, where she is a student. Angela plays piano and guitar, sings in the school choir, participates in Lincoln-Douglas Debate and loves to dance.

Liz Lochhead (Playwright) is a poet, playwright and occasional theatre director. She was born in Lanarkshire in 1947 and educated in Glasgow School of Art. Her collections of poetry include *Dreaming Frankenstein* and *The Colour of Black & White*. Her dozen original stage plays include *Blood and Ice, Mary Queen of Scots Got Her Head Chopped Off* and *Perfect Days* -- the "sister play" to *Good Things*. Her many stage adaptations, include versions of Molière's *Tartuffe* and *Miseryguts* (based on *Le Misanthrope*), Euripedes' *Medea* and *Thebans* (adapted mainly from Sophocles' *Oediputs* and *Antigone*). Liz lives in Glasgow and is currently writer-in-residence at, jointly, Glasgow University and Glasgow School of Art. She became the city's Poet Laureate in 2005.

Lauren Matesic (Costume Design), a Dallas native, started doodling pretty dresses when she could hold up a crayon, and started sewing at age 6. A master at the young age of 16, she worked on movie sets in the wardrobe department, including *Ray* starring Jamie Fox and *Midnight Clear* starring Stephen Baldwin. She spent 3 years in LA, graduated with an AA in Fashion Design from FIDM, and continued to work on theatrical productions, at Universal Studios, and building corsets for Farthingales in Santa Monica. She came back to Texas in January, continuing her corset and costume designing career here in Austin.

Jennifer Moore (Light Board Operator) recently graduated from Texas State University with a Bachelor of Education degree in Performance and Production. She is excited to be doing her first show at The VORTEX.
