DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Welcome to *The Government Inspector*. We selected this play in part because of Nikolai Gogol's stature as a Ukrainian writer, but also because Jeffrey Hatcher's smart and frothy adaptation had us laughing out loud when we read it. The conceit is brilliant – a hapless nobody is mistaken for a powerful government official by a gaggle of corrupt, small town officials. In return, our mistakenly fingered visitor is convinced that his considerable charm drives his sudden success.

Hatcher's adaptation premiered in 2008, but Gogol's original sprang from an idea given to him by his friend and supporter Alexander Pushkin in October 1835. Having worked as a clerk in St. Petersburg, Gogol was appalled at the greed and corruption and general lack of care in the Russian government. He told Pushkin he wanted to put together 'everything evil' that he knew about Russia and have a good laugh at it.

The undisputable universality of the story lies in its recognizable characters. You can see their contemporary counterparts on the television daily – and not only during the election season. Call this Slavic satire, if you will. With our tongues firmly in our cheeks, here we go!
