### DIRECTOR'S NOTE

At its core, *The Hunchback of Notre Dame* is a story about hope. Although the world can be cruel and ugly at times, there are moments we experience and people we encounter who remind us the world isn't always that way, and that the way to find these moments of light is to recognize what we have in common rather than to dwell on what separates us. Regardless of gender, race, culture, religion, politics, sexual identification, or socio-economic status, we all possess the innately human drive for meaningful connections. We love and want to be loved. We long to be seen and accepted for who we are.

The questions this show asks us to consider are eternally relevant: When faced with oppression, judgment, and discrimination, how hard are we willing to push back? Are we defined by what we are taught, or by an innate compassion and humanity within us? What wins in the end — nature or nurture? Which one defines who we really are? "What makes a monster and what makes a man?"
