Incorruptible

Thirteenth century France was a time of feudalism, poverty, starvation and disease. The King was away fighting, the Pope was considered a celebrity, medicine was virtually unheard of and illness was an act of God that could only be cured with prayer. Pilgrims and peasants regularly visited relics of saints in order to request an intercession for assistance. "Relics" are portions of a saint's body (collarbones, fingers, heads, feet, etc.) that have been removed and then distributed throughout various monasteries where pilgrims had to pay an obligatory donation to view them.

Due to the amount of money that could be made, the stealing and trafficking of saints' body parts was in high demand during these times so this story could have happened anywhere in Europe. An "Incorruptible," a saint so holy its body refuses to decay, is the holy grail of all relics. If a church was known to have an "Incorruptible," they would have an influx of pilgrims and peasants come wanting to view it, thus increasing the churches cash flow immensely and, in return, allowing the church to help the poor, sick, needy... and themselves.

Who's Who

Gary Payne (Director) Gary has been associated with over 80 theater productions as either an actor or director, dating back to high school in the late 60's. In addition to this theater work, he is also the Producer/Director of the Capital City Mystery Players, an almost 20 year Austin-based acting troupe specializing in interactive mystery dinner theater. He directed previous Paradox Players' productions of Vanities, Bus Stop, Our Town, and Trying, and has appeared on the PP stage in Sleuth, and Avow.

Erin Williams (Assistant Director/Dramaturg) This is Erin's third production with Paradox Players and her first time as an Assistant Director and Dramaturg. She worked lights and backstage in Charlie Cox Runs with Scissors and Shards of Love, respectively, and looks forward to contributing to many future productions with Paradox Players. She is working as a producer on an independent film Hank in Time, which is currently in production.

John Boehme (Stage Manager) John retired last year from teaching English and coaching basketball and football in the Austin Independent School District just in time to join Paradox Players. John stage managed Paradox Player's June play, Charlie Cox Runs with Scissors. His main claim to fame was working as Stage Manager for Ruth Denney at Lamar High School and mentoring at Houston's High School for the Performing and Visual Arts.

Matthew Burnett (Felix) Matthew's past credits with Paradox Players include Howie Newsome in Our Town and Justin Waverly in Dearly Beloved. Other acting credits include Wolf/Cinderella's Prince in Into the Woods, Orin in Little Shop of Horrors, and Carmen Ghia in The Producers. Matthew earned his B.A. in Drama from Trinity University in San Antonio, is a proud member of the Capitol City Mystery Players, and has starred in the films Theft, and Aaron...Albeit.

Megan Minto (Marie) is pleased to be making her debut with the Paradox Players. Megan has recently completed her role in Beyond Belief, a new feature film directed by Mike Akel (Chalk). She studied acting at The Stella Adler Conservatory in New York, and in Austin at The State Theatre School and The Austin Actor's Institute. She was previously seen in the Tutto Theatre Company's production of Jack, or the Submission. She has also performed in regional theatre in Florida and New York.

Don Owen (Charles) This is Don's seventh role with Paradox Players. Last year he played Judge Biddle in *Trying* and Norman Thayer, Jr. in *On Golden Pond*. His other roles were in *Bus Stop, Our Town, Avow, and The Rainmaker*. Other Austin stage credits, since relocating from northern California in 2005, include *The Hollow* with Different Stages, *Bent* at The Blue Theater, and, most recently, *Our Town* at Zach Theatre.

Rae Petersen (Agatha) Rae has been active in the Austin theatre scene since 2007. Recent roles include Mother in Red Balloon, Mama in 'night, Mother, Mommy in The Sandbox, and with the addition of Mother Superior in Incorruptible, a theme seems to be emerging. Rae is currently involved in the webseries, Once You Leave, slated to begin running in 2011. This is Rae's third production with Paradox Players, playing Jelena in Necessary Targets and stagehand/stage manager for On Golden Pond.

Frank Rios (Olf) Frank was born on the 28th day of December in the year 1975. It wasn't really cold that day because it was in South Texas and how cold does it really get down there? Nonetheless, later in life he gave acting a try. He's done *The Man of La Mancha*, *Ondine*, and several others. This is the first play in which he has not portrayed a villain. If you ask him, he's living the American Dream because it's just another day in paradise.

Ariel Ali Sauceda (Jack) This is Ariel's first production with the Paradox Players. Originally from Laredo, Texas, Ariel previously appeared in such plays as *Picasso at the Lapin Agile*, *The Foreigner*, and *The Importance of Being Earnest*. He hopes to continue acting and, eventually, explore directing. Ariel is also a songwriter/multi-instrumentalist and is active in the Austin musical community.

Cynthia Schiebel (Peasant Woman) This is Cynthia's fifth Paradox Players production. Her previous appearances were Oldest Profession, Social Security, and two Paradox Player Cabarets. Cynthia also performs with the Capital City Mystery Players and recently completed her fifth film with local writer/director Paul Bright. During daylight hours, Cynthia maintains a private counseling practice, conducts training and provides life coaching.

Georges Spelvineau (Martin) Georges has enjoyed performing on stage most of his life. His acting credits are many. He is pleased that he can draw on his darker side, as well as his French heritage, in this role. Though he knows many Catholics, he himself is a lapsed Lutheran.

Paullette MacDougal (Artistic Director/Co-Founder of Paradox Players)
Paullette is an award-winning playwright and filmmaker whose work has been seen widely in the U.S. and throughout the English-speaking world. She holds an MFA degree from Columbia University School of the Arts. Her drama Waiting for MacArthur was seen on this stage in 2003. Her comedy Shards of Love was produced here last February.

Ann Edwards (*Producer/Co-Founder of Paradox Players*) Ann has been Managing Director of Paradox Players since its founding in 1999. She's played roles in comedy and drama and has produced several shows for the company. She also directs PP Readers' Theater and Sunday Shorts.

Jean Boehme (Assistant Producer) Jean is a recently retired public school Pre-Kindergarten teacher. She has an extensive background in children's theater. Jean worked in community theatre in Houston with Company on Stage.

Bob Bethke (Set Design/Construction Supervisor) Bob enjoys set construction and being part of the Paradox Players family. His hard work organizing the work crew as well as our sheds is helping keep this motley crew afloat.

Note: The Bethke Stage is so named in honor of Susan and Bob Bethke for their leadership and hard work in renovating the Howson Hall stage.

Susan Bethke (Set Artist) Art is one of Susan's passions. As a retired nurse, she enjoys having the time to support the arts and be part of the Paradox Players crew, painting, and working on the sets. Paradox Players greatly admires Susan's ability to organize a painting schedule.

Barbara Weeks (*Props Supervisor*) As a long-time member of Paradox. Players, Barbara has done time backstage, in the tech booth, and at the precarious helm as a producer. She enjoys helping facilitate the PP Readers' Theater.

Tom Martin (Technical Director/Sound & Light Design) Tom is what every theater group absolutely must have — an engineer. He donates his time and expertise to help ensure that each Paradox Players production has the best possible sound, lights, and whatever else is needed.

Audrey J. Baker (*Tech Booth*) Audrey has been involved with Paradox Players as an actress, sound technician, and light operator since the first mUUses production. A member of First Unitarian Universalist Church she enjoys gardening and being a Dyslexia therapist.

Monty Newton (*Tech Booth*) Monty is an old hand at the tech board and is thrilled to return to his tenth Paradox Players production. A geologist by trade and a member of First Unitarian Universalist Church, he shares his Central Austin patch of heaven with his wife, two kids and 20 chickens.

Teri Rodriguez (Costume Design/Seamstress) Teri is a retired teacher, dancer, and costuming seamstress.

Kitty Traylor (*Program/Props*) Kitty became acquainted with Paradox Players as a member of First Unitarian Universalist Church, and has been helping with the program, props, tickets and concessions for several years.

Ashley Edwards (Public Relations) Ashley was in the recent production of Charlie Cox Runs with Scissors, and Shards of Love. She received her B.S. in Theatre Arts from the University of Louisville and studied acting at New York University and the Stella Adler Studio. She has also traveled the high seas as a production show singer and is a veteran of Florida's infamous "dinner theatre circuit." Previous Austin credits include Iolanthe with the Gilbert & Sullivan Society of Austin, Troades at the Vortex (B. Iden Payne award for Best Ensemble), and Io: A Myth About You with Shrewd Productions. She stage managed for Hyde Park Theatre and FronteraFest.

Amy Bennett (Front of House Supervisor) Amy & husband Gary discovered Paradox Players shortly after they moved to Austin in 2005, and have been House Managers ever since, so it seemed a natural move for Amy to accept the role of Front of House Supervisor this year. In her other life, Amy is a nursing instructor at Austin Community College. At home, Amy & Gary are house managed by three cats and a Corgi.

Kathryn Govier (Front of House Coordinator/Opening Night Food/Dècor) Kathryn has managed the Front of House Volunteers for Paradox Players for several years; she enjoys getting to know the people who are dedicated to making the theater operation work successfully. Kathryn is a musician in whatever spare time she has.

Veryan Thompson (Front of House Manager Recruiter) Veryan started out with the PP Readers' Theater, went on to work with ticket sales and concessions for mainstage productions, and currently coordinates the House Managers.

Bill Walters (Benefit Partner Coordinator) is in his first year as coordinator of the Paradox Players Benefit Performances. Bill is retired from a career in the military and computer industry. He is a member of UT's Continuing Education program, LAMP, which has participated with Paradox Players as benefit partner for seven years.
