ELISBETH CHALLENER (Managing Director) joined ZACH Theatre in Austin, TX as the organization's Managing Director in 2007. Elisbeth is responsible for a \$22M capital campaign toward the building of a new theatre as well as the management, development and finances of the organization. Under her guidance ZACH completed a Five

Year Strategic Plan that will move the organization into the next phase of its significant expansion.

Prior to Austin, she resided in the San Francisco bay area where she was Montalvo Arts Center's Executive Director, spending nearly 20 years with the organization. As Executive Director, Elisbeth led Montalvo's growth from a small, community-based organization into a major presenting venue and home to an internationally acclaimed artists' residency program.

Other accomplishments during her tenure included increasing ticket sales from less than \$500K to more than \$4 million, expanding the patron base from 6,000 to 80,000, and raising more than \$20 million for capital projects. Earlier in her career, she served as Administrative Director for the San Francisco Boys Chorus, Education/Outreach Director of the Fairmount Theatre of the Deaf, and as department chair and faculty member of the performing arts department of The Purnell School in New Jersey.

Elisbeth graduated from the Boston Conservatory of Music with a bachelor's degree in fine arts in drama and musical theatre. She attended the Harvard Business School Executive Education Program, The Center for Excellence in Nonprofit Management Leaders Institute in San Jose, Calif. and served in leadership roles for the American Leadership Forum, Silicon Valley, Saratoga Rotary Club and Arts Council of Silicon Valley. Elisbeth has served on the National Alliance of Musical Theatre Festival of New Musicals Committee and was recently elected to the Board and Executive Committee of NAMT. Elisbeth has always had a passion for the theatre and performed for many years in summer stock, dinner theatre, and semi-professional productions on the East Coast and in California.



The ZACH Theatre family is honored to celebrate with you the life and legacy of longtime ZACH Board Director and Ambassador Extraordinaire, Charles Gentry. Our beloved Charles departed this life on Friday, January 20, but he forever remains in our hearts and in our smiles. Charles joined the ZACH Board of Directors in 2000, but his relationship with ZACH as a supporter, advocate and enthusiastic fan extends decades. Producing Artistic Director Dave Steakley notes, "Charles was already a ZACH subscriber when I arrived 20 years ago to begin my work here. He was one of the first persons, along with his good friend John Whisenhunt, to welcome me into this family with a warm friendship that endured. He never let an opportunity pass without letting me know what ZACH and I had meant to his life, how proud he was of what we were accomplishing together, and how excited he was to make the Topfer Theatre a reality. His unflagging positive outlook and rock steady support of my artistic work are a continuum of my entire ZACH career."

Charles could be found participating fully at every ZACH opening night party, gala event, Board function and committee meeting, and often made his travel plans around his ZACH itinerary. His beaming face reflected the joy and passion he felt for his theatre and for all the ZACH artists with whom he became instantaneous lifelong friends. It was Charles' wish that he be remembered with a gift to ZACH.

Playwright's Note

HE LARAMIE PROJECT was written through a unique collaboration by Tectonic Theater Project. During the year-and-a-half development of the play, members of the company and I traveled to Laramie six times to conduct interviews with the people of the town. We transcribed and edited the interviews, then conducted several workshops in which the members of the company presented material and acted as dramaturgs in the creation of the play.

As the volume of material grew with each additional trip to Laramie, a small writer's group from within the company began to work closely with me to further organize and edit the material, conduct additional research in Laramie, and collaborate on the writing of the play. This group was led by Leigh Fondakowski as Head Writer, with Stephen Belber and Greg Pierotti as Associate Writers.

As we got closer to the play's first production in Denver, the actors, including Stephen Belber and Greg Pierotti, turned their focus to performance, while Leigh Fondakowski continued to work with me on drafts of the play, as did Stephen Wangh, who by then had joined us as an Associate Writer and "bench coach."
