About the Playwright:

An alumna of Southern Methodist University, playwright Beth Henley was awarded the Pulitzer Prize for Drama for her most famous play, Crimes of the Heart, which was originally produced at the Actors Theatre of Louisville in 1979, then in New York at the Manhattan Theatre Club where it continued on to Broadway. She earned a Tony Award nomination for the Broadway production, and also won the award for Best American Play of 1981 from the New York Drama Critics' Circle. The play was subsequently turned into a motion picture with Diane Keaton, Sissy Spacek, and Jessica Lange, and Henley was nominated for an Oscar for Best Adapted Screenplay. Other screenplays by Henley include Miss Firecracker starring Holly Hunter, Mary Steenburgen, and Tim Robbins, and Nobody's Fool starring Rosanna Arquette and Eric Roberts. She also collaborated on True Stories (1986) with Steven Trobolowsky and David Byrne, the lead singer of the Talking Heads, who directed and starred in the film. Henley's other plays include The Wake of Jamey Foster (1982), Am I Blue (1982), The Miss Firecracker Contest (1984), The Debutante Ball (1985), Abundance (1990), Control Freaks, (1992), Signature (1995), L-Play (1996), and Impossible Marriage (1998).

The Cast

James Hawkins (Reed Hooker)

James is a former ACC Drama student who has acted in over a dozen plays off and on since he was five years old, when he made his debut in a Spanish production of *The Wizard of Oz* as the Cowardly Lion. *The Lucky Spot* is his fifth collaboration with Shelby Brammer. Previous roles include Jeff in ACC's production of Eric Bogosian's *Suburbia*, and more recently, as Sterling in last fall's ACC production of *Mauritius* by Theresa Rebeck.

Yesenia Garcia (Sue Jack Tiller)

Ms. Garcia is an actress, advocate, entrepreneur and educator. She is a graduate of Southwestern University (B.A. Theatre & Communication) and The University of Texas at Austin (M.F.A. Acting). As a solo artist Ms. Garcia wrote, produced and performed a bilingual one-woman show titled, *Remembering Chevo*, at Dixon Place and Alvin Ailey in New York City. Internationally, she has performed and taught master acting classes through the Promising Performing Artists of the 21st Century Program in San Jose, Costa Rica. Ms. Garcia's film performances have been screened at LALIFF, SXSW, AFF, LA Short, Clermont-Ferrand Festival in France and by the Academy of Motion Picture

Arts and Science. Her commercial, print and voiceover work has had local, regional and national distribution for companies such as Verizon Wireless, Time Warner Cable, and Dr. Pepper, among others. Ms. Garcia is passionate about education and serves as an adjunct professor for Austin Community College's Department of Drama. She is the Founder and President of C2C Multimedia, a creative media production firm in Austin, Texas. Ms. Garcia is represented by The Atherton Group (TX, CA, LA). In the early 1990s, she returned to graduate school at the University of Iowa Playwrights Workshop where she was also a Directing major. As ACC Drama Department Chair for the past twelve years., she has directed *Lysistrata*, *Suburbia*, *Locked In The Arms Of A Crazy Life*, *A Phoenix Too Frequent*,

Celebration, Anything Goes, Hair, Blood Wedding, A Funny Thing Happened On The Way To The Forum, Proof, Under The Gaslight, and last fall, Mauritius.


