

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

I came across this play in the mid-1990s and remember feeling like I had begun reading a novel halfway through. It was bold and mysterious to be sure, yet simultaneously satisfying and unsatisfying. A viewing of a Dallas-area high school's UIL production did nothing to clarify but still intrigued me.

Fast-forward over a decade, and here I am with a group of 40+ students attempting to make sense of it. The mutability of family life (quarrels, jealousies, spoken and unspoken affections), the "micro-politics of the everyday" -- these are the kinds of situations that have always fascinated me. I enjoy the challenge of directing such scenes, trying to collaborate with the kids to bring meaning to such a dense puzzle. I have always been a questioner, and this play has left me with even more to ask. The script offers much to discover about isolation, silence, mistrust, alienation, and deep divisions within and between families.

I find Act Two to be particularly moving. The verbatim transcripts from interviews of people who were there made me want to learn more about life under Communist rule. It's made me wonder if distinctions like *public* and *private* have any meaning in a paranoid society, and it has given me a greater appreciation of having been born into a free one.

Initially, the students were not very fond of the script. And I have little doubt that many audience members will dislike it, too. That's okay with me. My hope is that whether you like it or dislike it, you will discuss it. I'm an educator, and the fact that one student said, "You know, Mr. Dragoo, before this play, I didn't even know there was a Romanian revolution in 1989" — that has made its mounting worthwhile.

TIMELINE OF THE FALL OF CEAUSESCU

December 15 -- Father Laszlo Tokes spoke out publicly against Ceausescu in the town of Timisoara. Backed by thousands, the riot police arrived to try and remove Tokes and disperse the crowd. A noisy and bloody battle ensued in the streets.

December 16 -- Securitate and the army were called in to restore order. The United States State Department reacts with, "It looks like Romania's time may have finally come", although the majority of the world still believed that Ceausescu will successfully maintain control.

December 17 -- A huge crowd amassed in Timisoara. The crowd became aggressive and marched on the Communist Headquarters at city hall. The demonstration was severely anti-government, as portraits of Ceausesecu were burned and thrown from the building. The army used tear gas, water cannons, tanks and amunition against the crowd. Many people were killed. The dead bodies were sent to Bucharest to be cremated.

December 18 -- The Executive Political Committee in Bucharest ordered the army to begin firing real bullets into the Timisoara crowd. Civilian casualties ran high. The dead were collected by the army and either thrown in mass graves or burned.

December 19 -- The resistance continued in western Romania, and the death count grew. It is believed that some of the army began to switch over to the side of the demonstrators on this day, although proof is impossible.

December 20 -- Negotiators from Bucharest were sent to Timisoara, but really only to buy time so that new elite troops could arrive to "crush the rebellion". The Securitate continued firing on demonstrators in the street. Ceausescu arrived home from a visit to Iran and proclaimed martial law. He also blamed the uprising on Hungarian Fascists.

TIMELINE OF THE FALL OF CEAUSESCU

December 21 -- In a televised speech, Ceausescu addressed a crowd in Bucharest. They became violent and tried to break police lines. A clash ensued in which at least thirteen youths were killed. Protests began breaking out all over the capitol, and the police began arresting demonstrators. The crowds refused to disperse and the police used gunfire and armored cars against the people.

December 22 -- Even more demonstrators began to reassemble early in the morning. Huge crowds were locked in a standoff with the army in the main square of Bucharest. Reports of dissidence between Ceausescu and his army caused the crowd to start chanting: "The army is with us!" The crowd offered the soldiers cigarettes and flowers and the battle seemed to be shifting to one between the army and Ceausescu's security police. In a last ditch effort, Ceausescu tried to speak from a balcony, but was shouted down. He and his wife fled the capital and made plans to leave Romania.

December 23 -- Confusion reigned. Fighting and brutality escalated in the streets. Some soldiers had switched over to the side of the people and continued to battle the Securitate forces. Ceausescu and his wife were captured and returned to Bucharest. Ion Iliescu emerged as a leader of the National Front and gave the government a list of demands.

December 24 -- The army continued to battle the Securitate in Bucharest. The National Front claimed control of the revolution and established a provisional government. Uncertainty and terror still prevailed in the streets. Nicolae and Elena Ceausescu were put on trial. He was unapologetic and refused to recognize the decision of the courts. In a matter of about two hours, they were both found guilty, sentenced to death, and executed.

December 25 -- The Ceausescu's bodies were exhibited on TV, marking the end of the initial stages of revolution. Despite this, fighting continued both in the capitol and in Timisoara. It is unclear when complete order was restored and even more unclear when Romania was able to regroup after these 11 days of revolution.

AHS THEATRE DIRECTOR



Director **BILLY DRAGOO** taught at Granbury High School and Bowie High School in Arlington before coming to Austin High in the fall of 1993. Mr. Dragoo earned a BFA from The University of Texas in 1987 and a Master of Arts from The University of London in 1990. In the summer of 2002, Mr. Dragoo was granted a scholarship to study at the Globe Theatre in

London. He has directed 74 shows in his career. Among his favorites are *Equus*, *The Secret Rapture*, *A Flea in Her Ear*, *Anna in the Tropics*, *Juno and the Paycock* and *Someone Who'll Watch Over Me*. He and his students at have appeared at the UIL One Act Play State Finals six times. Granbury High School appeared there in 1988 (taking third place in AAAA) and in 1989. Austin High School appeared there in 2007, 2008, 2009 (when they won the AAAAA State Championship), and in 2010. While teaching at Austin High, he has twice been named "Teacher of the Year" -- in 1997 and 2003.

ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHT

Born in London on September 3, 1938, Caryl Churchill grew up in England and Canada. In 1960, she received a BA in English from Oxford University. After graduation, she began to write radio plays for the BBC. The radio play genre greatly influenced Churchill, forcing her to develop a certain economy of style, and giving her the freedom to write very short scenes, with great leaps in time and space.

She served as resident dramatist at the Royal Court Theatre from 1974 to 1975. For over a decade, she also collaborated with theatre companies such as Joint Stock and Monstrous Regiment, both of which utilized an extended workshop period in their development of new plays and both of which are generally considered to have had a deep impact on Churchill's development as a playwright. Her successes during these years included *Light Shining on Buckinghamshire* (1976), *Vinegar Tom* (1976), *Cloud Nine* (1979), and *A Mouthful of Birds* (1986).

Even after striking out on her own, Churchill continued to utilize an improvisational workshop setting in the development of some of her plays. *Mad Forest: A Play from Romania* (1990) was written after Churchill, the director and a group of student actors from London's Central School of Drama went to Romania to work with acting students there and to find out more about the events surrounding the fall of Ceausescu. What finally emerged from this process was a play that revealed the dreadful damage done to people's lives by years of repression and the painful difficulties of lasting change.

Her awards include three Obie Awards (1982, 1983 & 1988) and a Society of West End Theatre Award (1988).


