

Director's Note

One of the (many) positive aspects of directing such a rich script is the opportunity it creates for learning things one didn't already know. I truly enjoyed increasing my knowledge by looking up all of the references in this play. I had no idea, for instance, that the title refers to *Die Walkure*, the second opera in Wagner's *Ring* cycle. In it, the Norse god Wotan sentences his errant daughter, Brunnhilde (leader of the Valkyries), to extended sleep on a mountaintop. But he softens the blow by surrounding her with a ring of magic fire penetrable only to a genuine hero, thus ensuring a worthy rescuer. Call me crazy, but learning that was exciting!

The play also appeals to me because it provides my students an opportunity to showcase their acting skills. (Ensemble plays with twelve excellent roles are, after all, difficult to come by!) It is important to me that the students have a chance not just to deliver clever or beautiful lines, but also to take a stab at creating memorable characters. And -- like the people who populate my own history – what characters they are! No doubt the world's greatest comedy is the human family – tragic yet poignant, perpetually offbeat, always out of sync, and littered with personalities of great extremes. That seems to be enough reason to mount this play. But I also just really enjoy the story and the questions it asks: Why do we create sanctuary in memories? Is memory reliable? Does memory believe before knowing remembers?

Background Information

Soldier and politician Juan Peron was thrice elected as President of Argentina, serving from 1946 to 1955 and again from 1973 to 1974. He called his movement *justicialismo* ("the third way") and considered it to be a path between capitalism and communism, although many middle- and upper-class Argentines saw it as far too socialist.

He and his wife, Eva were – and still are – considered iconic figures by followers of the Peronist Party. He was a controversial figure; some applauded his efforts to eliminate poverty and empower the working class, while others derided him as a demagogue and dictator. He made many enemies internationally because of his willingness to harbor Nazis Josef Mengele and Adolf Eichmann following World War II.

At the time this play is set, Evita had become a powerful political figure in her own right, campaigning for women's suffrage and developing social programs for the working class, whom she labeled the descamisados ("shirtless ones").



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

Coming to the Austin High Theatre...



a Music Theatre International Pilot production of the 2007 Tony Award-winning musical.

This is a rock-musical adaptation of the controversial 1892 German, SPRING AWAKENING by Frank Wedekind. It features music by Duncan Sheik and a book and lyrics by Steven Sater. Set in late-19th century Germany, it concerns teenagers who are discovering the inner and outer tumult of becoming young adults. In the musical, alternative rock is employed as part of the folk-infused rock score. *Spring Awakening* received eleven 2007 Tony Award nominations, winning eight, including Tonys for best musical, direction, book, score and featured actor. The show also won four Drama Desk Awards, while its London production won four Olivier Awards.
