About the Playwright:

Theresa Rebeck is a widely produced playwright in both the U.S. and abroad. Past New York productions include Mauritius, The Scene, The Water's Edge, Loose Knit, The Family of Mann, Spike Heels, Bad Dates, The Butterfly Connection and Our House. Her play, Omnium Gatherum was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize in 2003. Her newest play, The Understudy, was produced at the Roundabout Theatre Company as part of their 2009-2010 season. Ms. Rebeck also writes for television, including Brooklyn Bridge, L.A. Law, American Dreamer and Third Watch. She has been a writer/producer for NYPD Blue, and her produced feature films include Harriet the Spy and Gossip. Originally from Cincinnati, she holds an MFA in Playwriting and a PhD in Victorian Melodrama, both from Brandeis University

Production Team

Shelby Brammer (Director)

Shelby has been the ACC Drama Department Chair for the past decade. She was born in Austin, Texas, attended high school in Washington, D.C., was a Drama major at the University of Texas, and worked professionally as an actress/writer/director in New York City from 1976-1990, appearing in film, theatre and television, including as a regular on the ABC series, BREAKING AWAY. In the early 1990's, she returned to graduate school at the University of Iowa Playwrights Workshop where she was also a Directing major. During her time as Drama Dept. FLEA CIRCUS, a short film based on the novel, THE GAY PLACE by Billy Lee Brammer.

Peter Sukovaty (Scenic and Lighting Designer)
