




Directors Note

I first encountered The Mikado in college. I had recently moved back to the U.S. after spending six years living in Japan near my family and my new friend insisted we watch it on video. Immediately, my skin began to crawl and my stomach started to churn. White people with taped eyes and prosthetic teeth shuffled across the screen and bowed obsequiously while performing stereotypes of East Asians. When "Three Little Maids" began, I stood to say, "I can't watch this any more!" To which my friend said, "But... It's The Mikado!" Childhood memories came back to me of being called Jap and Chink, of being chased by people pulling their eyelids taut, and by always feeling like a racial impostor. Only a summer before that Mikado screening, in Boston, I found myself in a train station yelling, "I was born in this country!" at a stranger who passed me with, "All you chinks know is lying, cheating and fucking. Go back to where you came from!" My own racial encounters echoed deeper, more sinister ones. During World War II, the Yellow Peril was so pronounced, not only did our government imprison upwards of 100,000 people of Japanese ancestry (for "our protection"), but it had to publish pamphlets on "How to tell our [Chinese] friends from our [Japanese] enemies" in attempt to funnel racialized harassment and violence at the "correct" target. In fact, to this day, Japanese Internment is still considered constitutional. It could legally occur again at any point in time, and actually does in the form of immigrant family detention centers and refugee camps--where people who have not gone through due process of the law are confined as criminals. I know now that my friend's exclamation of "But... It's The Mikado!" was about her discomfort over her own pleasure, and a denial of my experience of ostracism. It is a common sentiment, evidenced by the fact that The Mikado is still staged in yellowface every single year across the country. I was tired of always being angry every time I heard of yet another yellowface production. I wanted to transform my deep-seated rage toward this piece and the people who continue to produce it "as-is", and instead use it as a reason to make work with other Asian Americans, and invite an audience to think about how our lives might enact various forms of confinement. The incarceration we depict is at once a prediction of the future, and re-enactment of the past, and a transmission from our present political state. We are none immune nor exempt from our own roles in dehumanizing others. The question now is how we re-instate humanity for all. May all beings be free.

The government decides to assemble people of East and Southeast Asian descent in Quarantine Camps to protect the population at-large. The Q-Camps also house those surviving internees of the recent "Muslim Ban."
