## Notes on the Play

Before encountering *Murder Ballad Murder Mystery*, it is essential to know and understand a few things about the typical broadsheet murder ballad. A folk tradition, murder ballads generally recount the details of a crime (legendary or true) while telling the story of the murderer behind the crime and his or her decision to kill. According to some sources, the ballad ends with the murderer in jail or on their way to execution. In some murder ballads, the victim invokes an element of supernatural revenge upon the murderer.

This framework is fundamental to understanding the production you witness tonight. *Murder Ballad Murder Mystery* presents its own lovely, complicated, and off-beat song inspired by the folk tradition. With a cast that includes some of the most famous murder ballad figures in our Western world, the play explores their stories as well as the human connections and questions within these stories that still make them vital and relevant to audiences today.

Elizabeth Doss began this work while living abroad in Spain, and it's not difficult to pick up on the yearnings of a traveler far from home in the fabric of the play. She is a native Texan, and the powerful imagery and sound of her writing reflect her central Texas roots. The water, the wild, the whimsy, the tough: These are all part of a personal and regional identity that translate into a work full of universal themes and rich with poetry.

The cast, crew, design team, and many volunteers who contributed to this production invite you to sit back, breathe deep, engage the mystery, and, like the character "B", enjoy riding shotgun for a change.

# Murder Ballad Murder Mystery Production Team

**Dustin Wills** (Director, Tutto Artistic Director) has worked as a director, playwright and performer in Texas and Rome. Italy. He is a graduate of The University of Texas at Austin and holds a B.A. magna cum laude in Theatre and Dance and English. Dustin also studied at Oxford and II Palazzo Antici Mattai in Rome. His productions have received 20 Austin Critic's Table nominations in the past four years including a win for Best Director in 2006 for his audacious production of Cymbeline and another this past year for Tutto's 2008 production of Ophelia - which won top honors this year at the recent B. Iden Payne Awards - Outstanding Production of a Drama. He had the privilege in 2007 of directing the world premiere of Ashes, Ashes by Eve Tulbert, which won the 2008 Kennedy Center Award for outstanding play for young audiences. Most recently he directed Black Snow, winner of the 2009 B.I.P. for Outstanding Production of a Comedy, and Five o Cinque at the beautiful 2nd century BCE amphitheatre, Teatro L'Arciliuto in Rome, Italy. After Shakespeare's England, Bulgakov's Russia, and Fellini's Italy, it seemed fit to come home - and being a child of East Texas. he really means home - to work on Elizabeth Doss' magical bayou musical. He thanks everyone who has been along for this ride!

#### Lisa Laratta (Set Designer, Scenic Charge Artist,

**Props)** graduated from UT with her M.F.A. in Theatrical Design. While in school she designed sets for: Katrina: The Girl Who Wanted Her Name Back by Jason Tremblay, Ashes, Ashes by Eve Tulbert and directed by Dustin Wills (Austin Critics Table and B. Iden Payne Nomination for Best Set Design), and the touring children's show Lily Plants A Garden by José Cruz González for which she also designed the lighting and projections. Since graduating, Lisa has worked for Tutto Theatre Company designing the sets for Ophelia and Black Snow, both directed by Dustin Wills (her work on both was nominated for an Austin Critics Table Award and she recently won the B. Iden Payne award for Scenic Design. for Black Snow), and also designed scenery for the dance piece Brierwood and Other Stories created and choreographed by David Justin. Lisa has worked at both The Blanton Museum of Art and The Harry Ransom Center as a coordinator and designer of various live performances within the exhibits. For film she was the production designer for the short [jean]=truth written and directed by SunHee Cho and the feature film jumping off bridges written and directed by Kat Candler. Before graduate school Lisa lived and worked in Toronto as a production designer and scenic artist for numerous theatrical and cinematic productions.

Megan M. Reilly, (Lighting Designer) Previous designs seen in Austin include: Black Snow and Ophelia, for which she received a B. Iden Payne Award, (Tutto Theatre Company), Mister Z Loves Company (Rubber Rep), Orestes (Cambiare Productions), Trouble in Tahiti (Butler Opera Center), Well Suited (Kathy Dunn Hamrick Dance Company), The King & I (Forklift Danceworks), Portrait, (David Mark Cohen New Works Festival), Minus Tide (Bayou Radio Theatre), Flesh and the Desert (UT Austin).
