Hello! And welcome to TexARTS' Kam and James Morris Theater for our second "Off Broadway Series" season of great professional theater! We're pleased to share with you a season of laughter and love with a touch of the bittersweet...a series of productions that each earned their place in the canon of beloved American musicals and theater for their ability to move people to laugh, sometimes to cry, but always to do what only great live theater can do - transform, entertain and inspire.



As we enter our fourth year-our second in this permanent space, made possible in part thanks to the generosity of Keller Williams of Lake Travis-TexARTS celebrates tremendous growth and popularity. From our Academy,

which now boasts over 530 registrations, to this professional "Off Broadway Series," which now boasts a regular audience nearing 1,000 patrons per show, TexARTS is setting the pace for a vibrant future. The institution's now three-quarters-of-a-million dollar budget sustains a regular staff of seven now and more than 8,000 square feet of facility. Nearly two-thirds of the budget goes to training youngsters in everything from musical theater to ballet to Shakespeare, visual art and much more for ages three thru adult. Some ten percent of the overall budget equates to free or reduced tuition for families in need. Some five percent represents Broadway guest artists & teachers coming to & from TexARTS to teach, direct and/or perform - continuing to raise the bar, inspire youngsters and audiences and set us apart from the rest.

One of the remarkable things about TexARTS is that we do so much - hundreds of youth class & rehearsal hours each week, 50 weeks a year...hundreds more each month in professional series rehearsal or performance and numerous community events ranging from Child Protective Services to the Junior League Christmas bazaar - on relatively so little. Where most nonprofits rely on 40% or more in contributions to survive, TexARTS has accomplished all this with just 10%. However, in order to stay healthy as we grow, we now need to increase contributed income so that we can...develop educational programs that will go into the public schools; expand our scholarship offerings; continue to keep only the best professional teachers & staff; bring on a production team leader to take on the tiresome work of coordinating and building our professional and student productions and; continue to keep our prices for classes, tickets and events affordable while maintaining only the highest quality.

We hope you'll join us in reaching our goals and reaching for the stars. And now, sit back, relax & enjoy the show!

Todd Dellinger, Executive Director & Robin Lewis, Artistic Director

Todd Dellinger (TexARTS Co-founder & Executive Director/Producer) is the Executive Director and cofounder of TexARTS. Todd was previously Executive Director for "A Noise Within" Classical Repertory Theater in Los Angeles and prior to that, Executive Director for the Elisa Monte Dance Co. and, earlier, Martha Graham Dance Co. and School in Manhattan. He has been a Director of Development for John Houseman's Acting Co. and California Music Theater, among others. Directing credits include *Always...Patsy Cline* at TexARTS, *Waiting for Godot* and the musical, *Working for The American University* and the upcoming TexARTS Great Shakes production of *A Midsummers Night Dream*. He has produced all of TexARTS' productions at the Paramount and here at the Kam & James Morris Theater. He has taught at The American University in Washington, D.C. and at St. Edwards University as well as various youth classes at TexARTS and elsewhere. As an actor, Todd performed in the company of the Shakespeare Theater at Folger and Arena Stage in Washington, D.C., Sacramento Theater Co. and for the Zach (HSM1) as well as on WUSA (CBS), Washington and in various industrial and commercial films.

Robin Lewis (TexARTS Co-founded & Artistic Director) is Artistic Director and co-founder of TexARTS. Robin is a veteran of Broadway shows *Fosse*, Disney's *Beauty And The Beast* (as well as the Los Angeles Company), *Victor/Victoria, A Christmas Carol at Madison Square Gardens*, and the first national tour of Mel Brooks' *The Producers*. Other tours include *A Chorus Line* and *Hello*, *Dolly!* as well as the Los Angeles company of *Beauty And The Beast*. Other regional include North Shore Music Theater, Beverely MA, California Music Theater, Santa Barbara Civic Light Opera and St. Louis Stages, among others. Directing and/or choreography credits include Oklahoma Lyric Opera, Zachary Scott Theater (Critics Circle & B. Payne winning, 2007 & 2008), Zilker Theater Productions (Critics Circle winning) and more, including various TexARTS productions at the Paramount (Critics Circle-winning) and more, including various Flame" by the Austin Chronicle this year. He recently was appointed Director of Musical Theater Dance, joining two other Broadway professionals in creating a national caliber professional training program for musical theater at Texas State University. Other teaching and/or guest teaching has included Cincinnati Conservatory of Music, Oklahoma Univ., adjunct professor for St. Edwards Univ and Univ. of Texas.







#### A BIT OF BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Order of the Little Sisters of Hoboken was founded in the seventh century by Saint Wilfred, a bishop of England. He established the first convent and school known as the Wilfrid Academy. His motto was "We don't teach beauty--we radiate it!" Many years later a small group of pioneering sisters set out for America to establish a mother house in Cleveland, but they got off the plane in Newark by mistake. The order was "found" by the Newark Airport Police and the new mother house was established in Hoboken, New Jersey. It was at that time that the Order of St. Wilfrid elected to change the name to the Little Sisters of Hoboken and they have been affectionately known as the "Little Hobos" ever since. It was from this convent that Sister Mary Cardelia, Sister Mary Hubert and Sister Mary Robert Anne, set said for the Mediterranean to establish their leper colony. Today the order has both nuns and brothers as members--all doing various good works in the Diocese of Newark. They also operate Mount Saint Helen's School in Hoboken.
