NOTES FROM THE DIRECTOR

This play was handed to me. Handed down. A weathered, and unshakable heirloom that has been burnished by thousands of hands on thousands of stages. Some performances were revolutionary. Some not. This play has made its way over the years into that slightly scary place where works of genius often land. In a box where things of remarkable beauty sometimes grow rust. It was placed in my hands at a time when my youthful ego wanted to say "Really?! Our Town." Why produce something that is over 70 years old that almost every high school in America has done? Then I sat down to read it for the first time. I was bored to tears in the first act. The second act went by, my eyebrows still cocked upward, skeptical. Then the third act came along...and proved me the fool. The landslide force of Wilder's brilliance leveled me, leaving me literally quaking, the words blurring through tears, his words punching holes through my choked throat. I sat a while almost afraid to touch the script as if it were a talisman. And I was even more terrified to take on the daunting task of directing it.

This is a play about the mundane stuff of life. Mundane in the sense that is it "of the earth." The stuff that is so universal and so talked about it, that is far easier to turn it into cliché than to give it authentic meaning. The work of daily life, first love, marriage, childbirth, death. All things that—in one form or another—we all know, we all go through. But Wilder has put the obvious in front of us in such a way that we actually see it. He has created a profoundly simple way to walk us unassumingly through the daily human existence of some imaginary town in New Hampshire, through the life-changing rite of marriage of some everyday couple 100 years ago, and right over the threshold between life and death down to dip our fingers into the very stuff of myth. The stuff "we all know" but don't take out and look at very often. The stuff that connects and fuels every moment of our lives...and that in the great rush of our "all-important" immediate existences, we are all too quick to overlook.

We have embraced the remarkable gift of this play. And we have brought our stories, our heirlooms, our towns to this process, warmly adding our fingerprints. We also have done everything we can to carry what Wilder intended for his audience into a context that can house it for our today. We offer it now to you. It is yours. We hope you can see as we did...this one didn't rust.


