

### From the Director



OUR TOWN

grew up in a small Texas town — Grandview, population 935 — a place very much like Grover's Corners. Our town was so small that once I mailed a card with an incorrect address and it was returned to my house, even though I had not included a return address. The post office simply recognized my handwriting. No surprise then that *Our Town* was the only play we ever read in Grandview — no Greek drama or Shakespeare or Arthur Miller, only Thornton Wilder's extraordinary classic.

When I first came to work at ZACH nearly 20 years ago, director Jim Fritzler and an all-star line-up of Austin actors and musicians created a beautiful production of *Our Town* that is one

of my most cherished theatre-going experiences. Last year when I was directing *The Grapes of Wrath* I found myself frequently referencing the characters in *Our Town* in rehearsal with my cast, and this fanned my desire to return to Wilder's world anew this season. I love this play. It is a touchstone we should all revisit at different stages in our lives as new truths unfurl.

All of the actors in ZACH's production are from Austin, some notables have graced our local stages for over 30 years, while others are making their professional debut. It's important to me that this company of actors come from our community, and that you may run into them at the grocery store or on the Hike and Bike Trail or at a live music venue and have the opportunity to have a conversation about our town. Many of these actors have previously performed in this play in a different role, and still this play moves us and reminds us and transforms us.

For our production I have chosen to perform it in contemporary dress and set it in what feels like Austin today to underscore the timelessness of this story, even though we have not altered Wilder's language. Emily and George's nuptials are one of the most significant events to happen in this play; because weddings are hyped as the most important day in a young woman's life, I have chosen to create a site-specific wedding that we will move to during ACT II in ZACH's new Bill & Bettye Nowlin Rehearsal Studio. This also opens the opportunity to create a different visual identity for each act of this remarkable play, united by a heavenly galaxy of stars. A star's mighty good company.

**ELISBETH CHALLENER** (Managing Director) – joined ZACH Theatre as Managing Director in 2007 after having served as a non-profit consultant and the Executive Director of One World Theatre since moving to Austin. As ZACH's Managing Director, Elisbeth is responsible for a \$20M capital campaign towards the building of a new theatre as well as the management, develop-

ment and finances of the organization. Under her guidance ZACH has just completed a Five Year Strategic Plan that will move the organization into the next phase of its significant expansion. Prior to Austin, she resided in the San Francisco bay area where she was Montalvo Arts Center's Executive Director, spending nearly 20 years with the organization. As Executive Director, Elisbeth led Montalyo's growth from a small, community-based organization into a major presenting venue and home to an internationally acclaimed artists' residency program. Other accomplishments during her tenure included increasing ticket sales from less than \$500K to more than \$4 million, expanding the patron base from 6,000 to 80,000, and raising more than \$20 million for capital projects. Earlier in her career, she served as Administrative Director for the San Francisco Boys Chorus, Education/Outreach Director of the Fairmount Theatre of the Deaf, and as department chair and faculty member of the performing arts department of The Purnell School in New Jersey. Elisbeth graduated from the Boston Conservatory of Music with a bachelor's degree in fine arts in drama and musical theatre.
