FROM THE DIRECTOR

What does a story about an Italian love triangle have to do with the notorious assassins of American history? A lot more than you would imagine. At first glance, these two musicals do not have anything in common other than the fact that they were both brilliantly constructed by Stephen Sondheim. Dig a little deeper, and our two stories share messages of love, violence, and the voices of those who live their lives neglected.

What does it mean to love, and to be loved? Love of our partners and spouses, love of family... love of country. There is love that fulfills you and love that can tear you apart. Passion explores various types of love through Giorgio, our Italian captain. At the start, he is passionately in love with Clara. Along comes Fosca, sickly, abrasive, dark. Fosca's love for him comes quickly and is passionate, obsessive, even threatening, as unrequited love can be. As Giorgio's journey with these two women unfolds, with

some influence from Dr. Tambourri, a questionable outside source, we watch as his love evolves and changes his life and those around him.


With Assassins, we watch as our ensemble transforms into historical figures, with one very intentional crossover from Act 1. Like Fosca and Giorgio, these impassioned characters go to great lengths to prove their love. For Hinckley and Squeaky Fromme, it was the love of another and a need to please that drove their madness. For some of the others, it was the love of their nation and the true belief that their acts could change the world for the better. With our assassins and with Fosca, there is a desperate need not only to belong, but more importantly, to be loved.

Both Passion and Assassins can be a challenge to accept for some audiences. In most stories there is a good guy and bad guy, and it's pretty clear who you are supposed to root for. As in several of Sondheim musicals, the line between good and bad is more than a little murky... remember the murderous barber you probably rooted for? This production will challenge you in that way. You will be given unsympathetic characters and then be asked to empathize. You don't have to approve, you don't have to love them, but I hope you will listen to their stories. Then come back... see it again... and continue to uncover the intricacies of these beautiful stories.

These two musicals are being performed in honor of Stephen Sondheim's 60th year on Broadway. He is of course a favorite here at TTC, and was deeply admired by our Randy Wilson. In order to perform the two shows together, Randy had to obtain special permission. He had been wanting to direct these productions for several years now, and it has been an absolute honor to do so in his place. This show is part of his legacy, which is not just for TTC to continue to entertain, but also to educate and challenge. This production has been a true labor of love, and I am eternally grateful to have been a part of it.

Don't forget about this year's Preview Party on Sunday, July 23! You won't want to miss the reveal of what is sure to be an unforgettable season.


Our story begins with Clara and Captain Giorgio Bachetti in a lovers' embrace. Soon after, he is transferred out of Milan to an outpost in the Italian countryside. There, he meets his commanding officer, Colonel Ricci, the unit's physician, Dr. Tambourri, and Signora Fosca, the Colonel's ailing cousin. While adjusting to his new life at his outpost, missing Clara all the while, Captain Bachetti slowly gets to know Signora Fosca. She in turn begins to have very strong feelings for him. Guided by Dr. Tambourri, Giorgio cautiously must navigate both Signora Fosca's feelings and his. With every decision he makes, he could be risking someone's life.

ASSASSINS

As Act 2 begins, we find several infamous characters from our nation's history, gathered together across time. With a familiar proprietor at the helm, the opening number gifts each assassin with his or her weapon of choice. Led by John Wilkes Booth, who assassinated President Abraham Lincoln, the story gives us a glimpse into each of our characters, their lives and the intentions behind their heinous acts. Charles Guiteau, assassin of President James Garfield; Leon Czolgosz, assassin of President William McKinley; Giuseppe Zangara, who attempted to assassinate President-elect Franklin D. Roosevelt; Samuel Byck, attempted assassin of President Richard Nixon; John Hinckley Jr., who attempted to assassinate President Ronald Reagan to gain the attention of actress Jodie Foster; Sara Jane Moore, attempted assassin of President Gerald Ford; and Lynette "Squeaky" Fromme, a follower of Charles Manson who also attempted to assassinate President Ford, all are present. Along with Booth and the proprietor, our assassins find themselves working together toward a common goal, which culminates on Nov. 22, 1963.




