#### A WORD FROM THE PLAYWRIGHT

In 1965 I arrived, a very troubled youth, at a private school in New Hampshire called Thomas More Preparatory School. Fifty-five boys were sequestered on a five hundred acre reservation on a mountaintop, for the purpose of education. I was from the Bronx, rather violent, a bit delusional, hungry for all kinds of things and wildeyed as a rescue dog. The teachers were all male save one, the Headmaster's wife, Louise Schmitt, and she taught myself and one other boy in her home. Our subject was The Wasteland, and we studied through a long winter and into the spring. I felt I didn't understand the poem, and I didn't care. I had seen a picture of T.S. Eliot, and I didn't like the look of him. He wasn't for me because I didn't want to BE him. That was how I judged poets then.

This play is my account of that time, the period during which my whole life was being decided. It is a true story for the most part. The changes I've made have been to simplify, or to make a point.

Most of the names remain unchanged, or only slightly altered. I wish you could have been there. I wish more generally that you could have shared my whole life with me, so we could discuss and compare. These plays I write are the best I can do to make that possible.
