She has been nominated for two Academy Awards, two Golden Globes, three Grammys and four Emmys. For Broadway, she wrote lyrics for Ragtime, My Favorite Year, Chita Rivera: The Dancer's Life and both book and lyrics for Once On This Island, Seussical and A Christmas Carol (Madison Square Garden). STEPHEN FLAHERTY (*Music*) writes music for theater, film, recordings and the concert stage. He is perhaps best known as the composer of the Broadway musicals *Ragtime* (Tony, Drama Desk, Outer Critics Circle Awards, two Grammy nominations), *Seussical* (Grammy and Drama Desk nominations), *Once on This Island* (Tony nomination, Olivier Award for London's "Best Musical") and also contributed music to *Chita Rivera*: *The Dancer's Life* (original songs) and Neil Simon's *Proposals* (incidental music). He has also written four musicals which have been produced at Lincoln Center Theatre: *The Glorious Ones* (Outer Critics Circle

and Drama Desk nominations), Dessa Rose (Outer Critics Circle and Drama Desk nominations), A Man of No Importance (Outer Critics Circle Award for "Best Musical," Drama Desk nomination) and My Favorite Year. Other theater scores include Lucky Stiff and Loving Repeating: A Musical of Gertrude Stein (Chicago's Jefferson Award for "Best New Musical"). Film credits include Anastasia (Academy Award nominations for "Best Score" and Best Song, two Golden Globe nominations and a gold record for its soundtrack), Bartok the Magnificent (original score and songs) and the documentary After The Storm. Concert work includes commissions from the Boston Pops, Carnegie Hall and the Guggenheim Museum. The Ahrens and Flaherty Songbook, a print anthology, is available through Alfred Music. His songs have been recorded by Aaliyah, Johnny Mathis, Richard Marx and Donna Lewis, Renee Fleming and Bryn Terfel, Donny Osmond, Thalia and Deana Carter, among others. Mr. Flaherty serves on the Dramatists Guild Council, where he co-chairs the Dramatists Guild Fellows Program for emerging writers with Lynn Ahrens, his longtime writing partner.

ZACH Leadership



DAVE STEAKLEY (*Producing Artistic Director*) – Now in his 22nd season, Dave is dedicated to creating a theatre of, by and for Austin – a place where our entire community comes together to share an intimate and extraordinary theatre experience, that is so powerful that its spirit cannot be contained on a stage. Under Dave's vision, the creation of the Topfer Theatre has come to fruition, opening October

2012 with *Ragtime*. Anna Deavere Smith says, "Dave is the future. The YES in his theater's walls is as palpable as the walls themselves. That YES, I believe, will lead to something brand new, to connect with a broader, more global audience."

With Dave's artistic leadership, ZACH has produced multiple World Premieres by Anna Deavere Smith, Steven Dietz, Everett Quinton, John Walch, Allen Robertson and The Flaming Idiots. ZACH served as the Central Texas hub of the nationwide 365 Plays/365 Days Festival by Suzan-Lori Parks. Dave created the first bi-lingual adaptation of Webber and Rice's musical Jesucristo Superstar, and set The Gershwin's Porgy and Bess in Katrina ravaged New Orleans with a jazz/R&B reinvention, which received national acclaim from The New York Times and about which Todd Gershwin says, "It was Dave's creative production of Porgy & Bess that really opened my eyes to the need to finally allow a creative team to interpret the opera in a fresh manner, which led to the current Broadway production."

Dave has served as the Producer, Director and Choreographer of more than 275 ZACH Productions, including: Next to Normal, Hairspray, August: Osage County, Rent, Metamorphoses, Our Town, Caroline, or Change, The Clean House, Take Me Out, I Am My Own Wife, Urinetown, Crowns, Omnium-Gatherum, Hedwig, Jelly's Last Jam, The America Play, Dreamgirls, Angels In America and the first professional repertory production of The Laramie Project and The Laramie Project: 10 Years Later.

His regional directing credits include Actors Theatre of Louisville, New Stage Theatre, American Heartland Theatre, WaterTower Theatre, and Pittsburgh's City Theatre. He is the playwright of *Rockin' Christmas Party* and *Keepin' It Weird*, featured on *CBS Sunday Morning*, NPR, *The Wall Street Journal* and *American Theatre*. Dave has served as a panelist for the National Endowment for the Arts, the Texas Commission on the Arts and the National Alliance for Musical Theatre.

The City of Austin declared May 18, 2001 and October 22, 2011 as "Dave Steakley Day" on the occasion of his 10th and 20th ZACH Anniversaries. He is the recipient of the 2010 Kick Ass Award, 2005 Austin Circle of Theaters' "Outstanding Contribution to Austin Theatre" Award, six *Austin Chronicle* "Best of Austin, Best Stage Director" awards, the 2000 Austin Under 40 Outstanding Arts & Entertainment Award, and multiple Austin Critics' Table and B. Iden Payne Awards for Outstanding Director/ Choreographer. In 2009, he was crowned Austin Dancing with the Stars Champion, and he has a cameo in Richard Linklater's 2012 film *Bernie*, in which he and Robin Lewis staged *The Music Man* musical numbers featuring Jack Black, Jill Blackwood and several ZACH actors.

ELISBETH CHALLENER (*Managing Director*) joined ZACH Theatre in Austin, Texas as the organization's Managing Director in 2007. Elisbeth is responsible for a \$22M capital campaign toward the building of a new theatre as well as the management, development and finances of the organization. Under her guidance, ZACH completed a Five Year Strategic Plan that will move the organization into the next phase of

its significant expansion.

Prior to Austin, she resided in the San Francisco bay area where she was Montalvo Arts Center's Executive Director, spending nearly 20 years with the organization. As Executive Director, Elisbeth led Montalvo's growth from a small, community-based organization into a major presenting venue and home to an internationally acclaimed artists' residency program.

Other accomplishments during her tenure included increasing ticket sales from less than \$500K to more than \$4 million, expanding the patron base from 6,000 to 80,000, and raising more than \$20 million for capital projects. Earlier in her career, she served as Administrative Director for the San Francisco Boys Chorus, Education/Outreach Director of the Fairmount Theatre of the Deaf, and as department chair and faculty member of the performing arts department of The Purnell School in New Jersey.

Elisbeth graduated from the Boston Conservatory of Music with a bachelor's degree in fine arts in drama and musical theatre. She attended the Harvard Business School Executive Education Program, The Center for Excellence in Nonprofit Management Leaders Institute in San Jose, California, and served in leadership roles for the American Leadership Forum, Silicon Valley, Saratoga Rotary Club and Arts Council of Silicon Valley. Elisbeth has served on the National Alliance of Musical Theatre (NAMT) Festival of New Musicals Committee and was recently elected to the Board and Executive Committee of NAMT. Elisbeth has always had a passion for the theatre and performed for many years in summer stock, dinner theatre, and semi-professional productions on the East Coast and in California.

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
