From The Director

hen I first saw RENT 14 years ago, I knew we would one day be producing this rock opera that shares so many characteristics with Austin — a youthful bohemian culture populated with musicians, artists and creative types who are trying to hang onto their soul while growing up, and struggling to keep the gentrification out of the cool parts of the city.

But another aspect of RENT resonated with me in an ever deeper, more personal way. I will always associate this musical with John Whisenhunt, the man for whom ZACH's arena



stage is named, even though he never saw the show. By 1991 when I came to work at ZACH, John had been on the Board of Directors for a dozen years and his passion as an audience member, advocate and supporter was unparalleled. Like actor Martin Burke's portrayal of the "Man in the Chair" in The Drowsy Chaperone, John had an enthusiasm for theatre that was contagious! We always joked back then that if there was a curtain going up in Texas, John could be found in the audience.

John died unexpectedly of AIDS to the shock of many of his colleagues and friends because he kept his illness private. A tragic end to a wonderful soul, who I found myself grieving shortly thereafter in the audience of a Broadway theatre throughout the performance of RENT. I made a vow that I would do what I could through ZACH to raise awareness and keep other beloved friends, audience members and ZACH artists from feeling the stigma, loneliness and hopelessness that John felt at the end. Since that time, our actors have collected contributions after performances for our friends at AIDS Services of Austin (ASA) who respond to HIV by providing services that enhance the health and well-being of individuals and the community in the face of this evolving epidemic.

Since 1996 ZACH's audience has generously contributed over \$150,000 to ASA. After this performance of RENT, our cast will be collecting your contributions in the lobby for ASA's Lee Manford Fund which provides the resources to ensure professional leadership retention and the longer term sustainability of the agency. Thanks to the Texas Commission on the Arts, there are HIV prevention educational materials available in our lobby and on the ZACH website, and we will be providing access to RENT performances for low-income individuals living with the disease. ZACH will also facilitate post-show discussions with our cast, and representatives from ASA, Project Transitions, ALLGO and Out Youth.

There are beloved HIV+ actors, musicians, designers and audience members at ZACH today, and like the characters sing in "La Vie Boheme," we toast to those "LIVING with, not dying from disease." No Day But Today.

ELISBETH CHALLENER (Managing Director) – joined ZACH Theatre as Managing Director in 2007 after having served as a non-profit consultant and the Executive Director of One World Theatre since moving to Austin. As ZACH's Managing Director, Elisbeth is responsible for a \$20M capital campaign towards the building of a new theatre as well as the management,

development and finances of the organization. Under her guidance ZACH has just completed a Five Year Strategic Plan that will move the organization into the next phase of its significant expansion. Prior to Austin, she resided in the San Francisco bay area where she was Montalvo Arts Center's Executive Director, spending nearly 20 years with the organization. As Executive Director, Elisbeth led Montalvo's growth from a small, community-based organization into a major presenting venue and home to an internationally acclaimed artists' residency program. Other accomplishments during her tenure included increasing ticket sales from less than \$500K to more than \$4 million, expanding the patron base from 6,000 to 80,000, and raising more than \$20 million for capital projects. Earlier in her career, she served as Administrative Director for the San Francisco Boys Chorus, Education/Outreach Director of the Fairmount Theatre of the Deaf, and as department chair and faculty member of the performing arts department of The Purnell School in New Jersey. Elisbeth graduated from the Boston Conservatory of Music with a bachelor's degree in fine arts in drama and musical theatre. She attended the Harvard Business School Executive Education Program, Center for Excellence in Nonprofit Management Leaders Institute in San Jose, Calif. and served in leadership roles for the American Leadership Forum, Silicon Valley, Saratoga Rotary Club, Junior League of San Jose and the Downtown Austin Alliance Parks Committee. She is currently serving on the National Alliance of Musical Theatre's Festival of New Musicals Committee.
