# **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**

Romeo and Juliet is a tragedy written by William Shakespeare early in his career about two young star-crossed lovers whose deaths ultimately reconcile their feuding families. It was among Shakespeare's most popular plays during his lifetime and along with *Hamlet*, is one of his most frequently performed plays.

The true tragedy for both Romeo and Juliet lies in the fact that their parents always had the power to end their dispute yet are too slow in exerting the precious influence needed to encourage peace. The message seems clear: Make and take opportunities to be an agent of change NOW because tomorrow it may be too late.

So, as we take you to the Italian Renaissance in this classical version of the play, perhaps you will be amazed at how perceptive Shakespeare was in his understanding of human nature, the constant danger of diverse ideologies, and the tragic results that occur when diplomacy, tolerance and common charity are left to fester and rot.
