What you can say about one of the best cast and crews I have ever had the opportunity to work with as they grapple and do battle with the finest comedy writer of the stage and screen? It has been such a joy to work on *Rumors* and I am truly grateful for every step of the way. If Broadway ever erects a monument to the patron saint of laughter, Neil Simon would have to be it. What a history for this legendary writer; first, churning out jokes for Sid Caesar's *Your Show of Shows*, where he worked alongside of Mel Brooks, Carl Reiner, and Larry Gelbart. Then, writing hit after hit for the stage and screen – *The Odd Couple, Sweet Charity, Barefoot in the Park, The Goodbye Girl, Brighton Beach Memoirs*; winner of four Tony Awards, two Emmys, a Screen Writers Guild Award and a Pulitzer Prize and holding the record for the greatest number of hits in the American theater. With all of this, he has kept us laughing for over fifty years. What is the secret to his success? That's hard to say. Maybe, between the lines of laugher, jokes, and bits, we come to find ourselves; a group of mixed up primates barely hanging on but still able to take pleasure in remembering the joys and loves of this imperfect, yet remarkable
