Director's Notes

SPRING AWAKENING is not only a groundbreaking rock musical but is also based on the original and still controversial German play by Frank Wedekind written in 1892. Its portrait of adolescence and the abusive power of adults toward children is so honest and graphic that it was banned from being performed in Britain until 1963. While still raw in its depiction of the trials of teenagers, this new musical version is a much more emotional and soulful version than the original play due to the haunting melodies of Duncan Sheik.

When approaching the musical with the creative team, I challenged them to look at the work from the view of the original play again- its language, period, structure. I wanted the scenes to be clearly in the period but still enable the rock show to burst through. I have worked with the cast, many of whom are still teenagers themselves, to create a sense of trust and ownership of the material. I asked them, as I am asking you, to remember how wonderful and horrible adolescence was as we tell this timeless story of change, love, discovery, heartbreak, anger, and ultimately triumph once again. It is easy to dismiss the youth of today as our parents did as selfish and foolish, but this only diminishes our own journey and prevents us from understanding ourselves and where we come from. I wish I could say as people we are evolving, but deep down I think when we see works like Spring Awakening there is evidence that we are just reliving the same trials over again that have been experienced for generations.

The hope is that as individuals and as a society we can continue to learn for ourselves how power can corrupt, how withholding knowledge is a dangerous, and how it is in our best interest to "listen to the heart of a child...to hear where beauty lies" so that our children can be free of our adult fears.

Baron also wrote and directed The Whore of Sheridan Square at La Mama, and the play is published in the anthology *Plays and Playwrights 2006*. He has taught at American University, Brown University, Holy Cross College and Rhode Island College. He received a 2003-2005 NEA/TCG Directing grant and has been a theatre grant panelist for the National Endowment for the Arts and the Massachusetts Council on the Arts. His training includes a B.A. in Theatre Arts from Wake Forest University and an M.F.A. in Directing from Trinity Repertory Conservatory. He also served from 2006-2010 as the Associate Director of Signature Theatre in Arlington, Virginia, winner of the 2009 Regional Theatre Tony Award.



ALLEN ROBERTSON (Musical Director/Conductor) – Allen is an Emmy Award®-winning co-creator of the PBS children's show The Biscuit Brothers, as well as a co-producer, performer, writer, educational director and composer for the show. Allen is an award-winning musical director, composer, playwright, actor, director, sound designer and musician, and has worked on hundreds of productions from Chicago to Japan and just about everywhere in between - including 20

years of shows at ZACH. New York credits include Radio City Music Hall and the Off-Broadway run of *The Flaming Idiots*. As a vocalist, he can be heard on several Disney Records as well as television and radio commercials. Additionally, he is a composer with credits including the film *Beyond Black Rock*, the musical *Jouet* and the ballet *Secret Garden*.



ANDREA BECKHAM (Choreographer) – is a choreographer, dancer and educator, and joins ZACH Theatre for the first time. A longtime participant in the Sharir Dance Company (Sharir+Bustamante Danceworks), she has also performed with Llory Wilson's Tallulah Dance Company in Seattle and on tour as a dancer, with Bill T. Jones/Arnie Zane Dance Company in New York, among many others, and has developed more than 25 new works with her own pick-up

company, Andrea Beckham Collaborative Dance. Andrea is currently teaching dance at the University of Texas at Austin, as well as running the Pilates-evolved Movement/Physical Conditioning Laboratory there, and recently received the Regents' Outstanding Teaching Award.



MICHAEL RAIFORD (Scenic Design) – is a freelance scenic and costume designer based in Austin. Michael has been a resident designer at ZACH Theatre for almost 20 years, where he has designed more than 100 productions. Recent ZACH projects include Hairspray, The Book of Grace, August: Osage County, Rent, The Drowsy Chaperone, Becky's New Car, Let Me Down Easy, Love Janis, Shooting Star, Caroline or Change and The Clean House. Michael has also

Other favorite regional productions include Well, The Chosen, and Inherit The Wind at Cleveland Playhouse; The Young Lady from Rwanda at Kansas City Repertory Theatre; Guys and Dolls and Tin Types at the Maltz Jupiter Theatre, Florida; The Bartered Bride at Opera Boston; The Fantastiks at Ford's Theatre in Washington, DC; and What Goes Up at New Victory Theatre, NYC. STEVEN SATER (Books & Lyrics) - was awarded the 2007 Tony Awards for "Best Book of a Musical" and "Best Original Score" for Spring Awakening along with the Drama Desk and Outer Critic Circle Awards for "Best Lyrics." With alt-rocker Duncan Sheik, he received the 2007 Grammy Award for "Best Musical Show Album" for Spring Awakening. The pair received The Dramatists Guild Hull-Warriner Award, the Outer Critics Circle, the Drama Desk, the Lucille Lortel, New York Drama Critics' Circle and Drama League Awards for "Best Musical." Steven is the author of numerous plays, including the long-running Carbondale Dreams, Perfect for You, Doll (the Rosenthal Prize, Cincinnati Playhouse); Umbrage (Steppenwolf New Play Prize); A Footnote to the Iliad (New York Stage and Film, The Miniature Theatre of Chester); Asylum (Naked Angels); Murder at the Gates (commissioned by Eye of the Storm); In Search of Lost Wings (Sanford Meisner Theater) and a re-conceived version of Shakespeare's Tempest, with music by Laurie Anderson, which played London's Lyric Hammersmith and toured throughout Great Britain. In addition to Spring Awakening, Sater has collaborated with Sheik on the NY premiere of Umbrage (HERE), Nero (The Magic Theatre, workshopped at the New York Shakespeare Festival and New York Stage & Film) and The Nightingale (workshopped at the O'Neill Musical Theatre Conference, La Jolla Playhouse, A.C.T., and New York Theater Workshop). He is also hard at work with System of a Down's Serj Tankian on a musical version of Prometheus Bound, to be directed by Diane Paulus at the American Repertory Theater. Sater is the lyricist for Sheik's critically acclaimed album Phantom Moon (Nonesuch), and together the two wrote the songs for Michael Mayer's feature film A Home at the End of the World (Warner Classics) as well as the independent features Brother's Shadow and Mary Stuart Masterson's The Cake Eaters. Sater is also co-creator and executive producer, with Paul Reiser, of recent pilots for both NBC and Sony/FX, and has developed two projects for HBO, and another for Showtime (with Reiser). He is also at work, with Jessie Nelson, on a feature film and is creating an original movie musical for producer Larry Mark. In addition, Steven works as a lyricist with various composers in the pop/rock world, recently writing songs with Burt Bacharach, Johnny Mandel, Andreas Carlsson, and William Joseph.
