
What is Steampunk?

Steampunk is a sub-genre of science fiction, alternate history, and speculative fiction that came into prominence during the I980's and early I990's. Specifically, steampunk involves an era or world where steam power is still widely used—usually the I9th century and often Victorian era Britain—that incorporates prominent elements of either science fiction or fantasy. Works of steampunk often feature anachronistic technology or futuristic innovations as Victorians may have envisioned them; in other words, based on a Victorian perspective on fashion, culture, architectural style, art, etc. This technology may include such fictional machines as those found in the works of H. G. Wells and Jules Verne or real technologies like the computer but developed earlier in an alternate history.

Other examples of steampunk contain alternate history-style presentations of "the path not taken" for such technology as dirigibles, analog computers, or such digital mechanical computers as Charles Babbage and Ada Lovelace's Analytical engine.

Leenane at The Vortex. This is his second adaptation produced by SBCT, his first being *The Wizard of Oz*, produced by our Youth Guild.



A WORD FROM THE DIRECTOR

Sometimes, inspiration comes in the strangest ways... This script came about when I saw a posting on AustinActors.net looking for a set designer for a steampunk bar. Since steampunk was a word I was unfamiliar with, I immediately set out on the internet to find out what it was. Imagine my surprise when I discovered that I did indeed know what it was... I just didn't know that it had a new word to describe it. I'm a big fan of Science Fiction and Fantasy as entertainment genres and steampunk is essentially the world of Jules Verne, but sort of on steroids. I also discovered that there were diverse theatre companies around the globe producing steampunk Shakespeare... but no one had set out to translate The Tempest into that genre... and that both surprised and intrigued me. It seemed such a natural for that kind of adaptation. So, I set about having conversations about a concept I had to do a steampunk Tempest and everyone I talked to liked the idea. SBCT's play selection committee also liked the idea and asked me to do a treatment and present it. I did about a third of the script and presented it. They liked that first draft enough to ask me to finish the adaptation and submit it for the season. As I worked on it, I hit on the idea of keeping the islanders in Shakespearean English, but translating the foreigners to the island into more contemporary speech. As I did that, the problems with length vanished and I found out that I had to cut little to make the adaptation work. The idea of changing the genders of Prospero and Caliban was part of my idea from the very beginning. I wanted to create strong roles for women. The other gender changes in characters came during the casting process. As with any new work, there have been daily rewrites and changes... and ultimately I am very pleased with the show we present to you tonight. I was blessed with an exceptionally talented cast and a flock of people who wanted to design the world that the characters inhabit. My immense thanks to Kevin, Roni, Leila, Lynn, Chandra and Vanessa for all the time they have put into the images you see before you tonight and to Nate for tackling the daunting task of composing an original score. I hope you enjoy The Tempest Project as much as I have bringing it to life.


