

Eric Austin (Pierre): Born and raised in Delaware, Eric started acting as a member of the Lollipop Guild in a summer camp production of *The Wizard of* Oz. He is a BFA graduate of NYU, Tisch School of the Arts (Atlantic Theatre Company, Experimental Theater Wing). Recent credits include *The Last Days of Judas Iscariot* (Butch Honeywell), *This Is Our Youth* (Dennis), *Much Ado About Nothing* (Don John), *A Few Good Men* (Kendrick), and *Take Me Out* (Jason Chenier).

Joel Gross (Man): Joel recently closed the successful *Pocatello* with Street Corner Arts, and is proud to debut with Jarrott Productions. Away from town for over a decade before this, Joel was on stage and screen in Chicago, New Orleans, North Carolina and NYC. Favorite Chicago credits include: *The History Boys, To Master the Art* and *The Normal Heart* (TimeLine Theatre, all multiple Jeff Award Winners), *In the Next Room Or: The Vibrator Play* (Victory Gardens), *Three Tall Women* (Court Theatre), and *1001* (Collaboraction).

David R. Jarrott (Andre): David most recently appeared in Jarrott Productions season opener *Prodigal Son* last fall. This is his 5th production as Artistic Director for this company and he is extremely proud of all of the amazing talent that he has been honored to work with. Selected regional theatre: *The Great Society, Ragtime* and *Side Man* (Austin Critics Table Nomination/Best Supporting Actor) at Zach; *Freud's Last Session* (B. Lori Kovacevich (Laura): Having moved to Austin a short two years ago, Lori is just starting to break into the local film scene. Chris Conard (Lighting Designer): An Austin-based Designer and Artist, Chris graduated from SFUAD in Santa Fe with a BFA in Technical Theater design in 2014. Since graduation, he has focused on expanding his skill sets, and exploring the intrinsic connection between art and the viewer.
