THE PLAYWRIGHT

TopDog/Underdog is the kind of high-wattage theatre that audiences have come to expect in Austin, and its appeal everywhere is demonstrated by its enormous success. Named one of TIME Magazine's "100 Innovators for the Next New Wave," Suzan-Lori Parks grew up in West Texas and is one of the most exciting and acclaimed playwrights in American drama today. She is the first African American woman to receive the Pulitzer Prize in Drama. In 2007, her directing and acting project 365 Plays/365 Days was produced in over seven hundred theatres worldwide, creating one of the largest grassroots collaborations in theatre history. Her numerous plays include In the Blood, The Death of the Last Black Man in the Whole Entire World, Imperceptible Mutabilities in the Third Kingdom and The America Play. In 2008, she became the first recipient of the master writer chair at The Public Theater and Tisch School of the Arts working as a visiting arts professor in dramatic writing. Her play, *The Book of Grace* premiered during the 2009-10 season at The Public Theatre with national productions starting in 2011. Holding an honorary doctorate from Brown University, Ms. Parks credits her writing teacher and mentor, James Baldwin, who was one of the first to recognize her writing skills. Mr. Baldwin declares Ms. Parks "an astonishing and beautiful creature who may become one of the most valuable artists of our time."

Abraham Lincoln and 3 - card monte

In 1999 I was thinking about a play I'd written seven years earlier called *The America Play*. In that play's first act we watch a black man who has fashioned a career for himself: he sits in an arcade impersonating Abraham Lincoln and letting people come and play at shooting him dead – like John Wilkes Booth shot our sixteen president in 1865 at Ford's Theatre. So I was thinking about my old play when another black Lincoln impersonator, unrelated to the first guy, came to mind: a new character for a new play. This time I would just focus on his home life. This new Lincoln impersonator's real name would be Lincoln. He would be a former 3 – card monte hustler. He would live with his brother, a man named Booth.

My interest in 3 – card monte began one day when my husband Paul and I saw some guys doing the shell game. I was fascinated because, while I'd seen the scam before, this time I had someone whispering in my ear, a kind of play – by – play, explaining the ins and outs of the scam. When we got home that day I was sat down and showed how to throw, to lift, to hide and to win.

This is a play about family wounds and healing.
