
We are a large and complex department that places great faith in our diversity, our ability to collaborate and our common purpose to make a difference through theatrical performance.

The Trojan War began when Helen, Queen of Sparta left her husband Menelaus with the Trojan prince Paris. To win her back and take revenge, a coalition of Greek armies set out for Troy. When they arrived, they surrounded the city and laid siege to it. It soon became clear, however, that the sides were evenly matched. The Greeks could not take the city, but the Trojans could not defeat them on the battlefield. This period saw many deaths, including the Greek champion Achilles and the Trojan champion Hector, but neither side gained a lasting advantage. Finally, after ten years, the Greek army knew that they could only win through deceit. Acting on a plan created by Odysseus, they constructed a giant wooden horse outside Troy's walls and pretended to sail away from Troy. Thinking the Greeks had finally surrendered, the Trojans took the horse inside the city walls. When night fell, Greek warriors emerged from the horse and slaughtered the unsuspecting Trojans. This is the moment in which *The Trojan Women* begins.

Since its first production, *The Trojan Women* has been a dangerous play. Euripides, who lived from approximately 480 to 406 BCE, was arguably the most controversial of all the Athenian playwrights. He was often criticized for his depiction of the gods, whom he portrayed as petty, vindictive, or ridiculous. Like all Greek tragedies, Euripides's plays were written to compete in the annual City Dionysia, one of the most important festivals in Athens. He wrote over 95 plays, Euripides only won the competition five times, probably as a result of these controversies. In contrast, the other major Athenian playwrights Aeschylus and Sophocles won thirteen times and twenty five times, respectively.

With The Trojan Women, Euripides offers a pointed critique of his fellow Athenians' treatment of their enemies. Most scholars agree that Euripides wrote The Trojan Women at least partially as a response to the Peloponnesian war, which raged between Athens and Sparta from 431 to 404 BCE. In 416 BCE, the year before Euripides wrote The Trojan Women, the Athenians attacked the neutral island Melos. Like the Greek armies in The Trojan Women, the Athenians murdered all the men of Melos and sold the women into slavery. The play's critique of the senseless brutality of war would therefore have hit quite close to home for audiences, particularly since those who instigated the attack on Melos were still in power and were planning a similar raid on Sicily. The Trojan Women is also radical because it focuses on the experiences of women during the war rather than on those of the heroes. In this way, Euripides rejects the romantic tales of bravery and daring and focuses on the real, physical ramifications of war.
