

Cast

Polaris Banks

(Mike Talman)

Polaris began his career in the theatre at a young age with roles such as Scrooge in *A Christmas Carol*, Romeo in *Romeo and Juliet*, and the title role in *Hamlet*. As a teenager he appeared as Cripple Billy in *The Cripple of Innishmaan*, Reverend Hale in *The Crucible*, Royce in *Dearly Departed*, and Jim Casey in *The Grapes of Wrath*. He has since worked exclusively in film. *Wait Until Dark* marks Polaris' return to the stage after a five year hiatus.

Tysha Calhoun

(Susy Hendrix)

Tysha appears again onstage at the GBT continuing her love affair with the theatre. She was most recently seen in *Almost, Maine*, and directed *The Hand That Cradles the Rock* as well as last season's *Amateurs*. She was also seen in *Orphan Girl*, and *The Paris Letter*. She received a BA in Theatre Arts from Sweet Briar College. Some of her favorite collegiate roles were as Beth in *A Lie of the Mind* and Mama Rose in *Gypsy*, for which she was nominated for the Irene Ryan Award. When not at the theatre, Tysha pursues other creative outlets such as singing, songwriting and painting. She and her husband Pat reside in San Marcos and are the proud parents of three furry kids, and spend as much time as possible camping, hiking, and kayaking. They continue to vacation seeing as many State and National Parks as possible. She has been blessed to work with such a talented cast and crew and has had a blast bringing Susy to life.

Gillian Hickman

(Stage Manager)

Gillian has become a fixture at the Gaslight-Baker since playing Marvalyn in *Almost*, *Maine*. Since then she has appeared onstage as Caitlyn O'Hare in *Over the River* and *Through the Woods* and as Mary Pickaxe in *Peril on the High Seas*. Gillian also stage managed for *The Hand That Cradles the Rock* earlier this season. *Wait Until Dark* marks her 5th production with the GBT and she is looking forward to being involved with many more.

Steve Lawson (Sam Hendrix)

Acting has come late in Steve's life experience, having grown up a largely anti-social geek and nerd, and remaining much that way until experiencing an epiphany of introspection shortly before the new millennium. His very first theater experience was as Kris Kringle in *Miracle on 34th Street* in 2001. His transformation was quite a surprise to family and friends. Then, just a few months later, he was fortunate enough to be cast as Lenny in *Of Mice and Men*. The experience of touching a live audience with such powerful emotion as is contained in that piece drew him inextricably into the world of acting. Thus in his subsequent short theater tenure he has acted and directed in nearly thirty plays, and has dabbled in film work. He

reports that "It's been an exhilarating ride!" Favorite theater experiences include playing Elwood P. Dowd in *Harvey*, Adam in *The Diaries of Adam and Eve*, George Bailey in *It's a Wonderful Life*, and Sandy Sonnenberg in *The Paris Letter*.

Mark McDade

(Policeman)

Mark is a San Marcos based musician and songwriter. He has appeared at music venues all over the country. His last appearance on the Gaslight-Baker stage was as Virgil in last season's production of *Bus Stop*. He is thrilled to be making his return in *Wait Until Dark*.

Cruz Thomas

(Carlino)

Cruz is making his debut at the Gaslight-Baker Theatre. His stage experience includes Orgon in *Tartuffe*, Loyd in *Reckless*, and Stephano in *The Tempest*. Cruz has also had roles in a number of films including lead roles in *My Brister* and *Extended Family* with Guiding Star Productions.

(Policeman)

A word from the Director

Greetings and welcome to the Gaslight-Baker Theatre! Thank you for attending this performance of Frederick Knott's classic thriller *Wait Until Dark*. My own history with this show dates back to 1993 when, as a recent high school graduate, I attended a production of *Wait Until Dark* at The Post Playhouse in Ft. Robinson, Nebraska. After the thrilling performance, I promised myself that at some point in my life I would be part of a production of this spine-tingling story. Little did I know I would have the opportunity to be the director. What a wonderful experience it has been!

There are many elements that make *Wait Until Dark* exciting, but what I find so compelling about the story is how the author uses our senses of sight and sound to propel the story into the realm of psychological terror. From the squeaking shoe on the staircase to the climactic battle in the dark between Susy and Roat, there is no end to Mr. Knott's usage of what is heard and seen – or not seen – to heighten the tension felt by the cast and the audience. In this vein, I elected to leave an opening in the set wall that allows the audience to see characters coming and going, and to elevate the fact that Susy can see nothing.

I am so excited to share these moment with you. Thanks again for coming, and prepare yourself for the thrilling and terrifying ride that is *Wait Until Dark*!
