
### Director's Notes

### **LEAP & DREAM**

In 1954, the Paramount Pictures musical film *White Christmas* premiered starring Bing Crosby, Danny Kaye, Vera-Ellen and Rosemary Clooney. With a grand score by Irving Berlin, it was an instant success, becoming the top grossing film of that year and - soon after - a holiday classic.

Who amongst us doesn't feel some sort of nostalgia the second you hear the glorious tones of its title song? It immediately harkens us back to childhood, a time of innocence, of love and holiday joy.

The stage adaptation, while honoring this great cinematic work, takes on a life of its own. Premiering in 2004, the book writers took a modern look at the 1950s. It beckons us to a time before cynicism and the social revolution of the 1960s, is a tribute to the great veterans of the Second World War and is a love letter to Broadway show folk.

At its heart, it is the story of the true meaning of friendship. It asks us to suspend belief for a few hours, and take an adventure through song and dance.

The film choreography by an uncredited Bob Fosse is highly influential in our stage production at ZACH. Some of the storytelling comes directly out of the dances – and in other sequences, it is there strictly to entertain. Either way, it asks you to take a leap and dream.

Perhaps that is why this musical is so fitting for ZACH's inaugural Dream season. Allow yourself a few hours out of your hectic, modern life to sit back, reminisce of holiday memories and enjoy the festive journey.

IRVING BERLIN (Music and Lyrics) – Born Israel Beilin on May 11, 1888, and one of eight children, Irving Berlin's family immigrated to New York in 1893. When his father died, Berlin, just turned 13, took to the streets in various odd jobs, working as a busker singing for pennies, then as a singing waiter in a Chinatown Cafe. In 1907 he published his first song, "Marie from Sunny Italy," and by 1911 he had his first major international hit — "Alexander's Ragtime Band." During the next five decades, Irving Berlin produced an outpouring of ballads, dance numbers, novelty tunes and love songs that defined American popular song for much of the

century. A sampling of just some of the Irving Berlin standards includes "How Deep Is The Ocean," "Blue Skies," "White Christmas," "Always," "Anything You Can Do I Can Do Better," "There's No Business Like Show Business," "Cheek To Cheek," "Puttin' On The Ritz," "A Pretty Girl Is Like a Melody," "Heat Wave," "Oh! How I Hate To Get Up In The Morning," "Easter Parade" and "Let's Face The Music And Dance." In a class by itself is his beloved paean to his beloved country, "God Bless America." He was equally at home writing for Broadway and Hollywood, writing 17 complete scores for Broadway musicals and revues, and contributed material to six more. Among the shows featuring all-Berlin scores were The Cocoanuts, As Thousands Cheered, Louisiana Purchase, This Is the Army, Miss Liberty, Mr. President, Call Me Madam and the phenomenally successful Annie Get Your Gun. Among the Hollywood movie musical classics with scores by Irving Berlin are Top Hat, Follow the Fleet, On the Avenue, Alexander's Ragtime Band, Holiday Inn, Blue Skies, Easter Parade, White Christmas and There's No Business Like Show Business. His songs have provided memorable moments in dozens of other films, from The Jazz Singer (1927) to blockbusters such as Home Alone (1991) and Titanic (1997). Among his many awards were a special Tony Award (1963) and the Academy Award for "Best Song of the Year" for "White Christmas" in 1942. Berlin was a co-founder of ASCAP (American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers), founder of his own music publishing company, and with producer Sam Harris, builder of his own Broadway theatre, The Music Box. An unabashed patriot, his love for - and generosity to - his country is legendary, and through several of his foundations,

including The God Bless America Fund, he donated millions of dollars in royalties to Army Emergency Relief, the Boy and Girl Scouts and other organizations. His actions were acknowledged with such accolades as the Army's Medal of Merit from President Truman in 1945; a Congressional Gold Medal for "God Bless America" and other patriotic songs from President Eisenhower in 1954, and the Freedom Medal from President Ford in 1977. In 2002, the U.S. Army at Fort Belvoir, Virginia, named the Army Entertainment Division (AED) World Headquarters "The Irving Berlin Center" in his honor. Also that year he was commemorated on a U.S. postage stamp. Irving Berlin's centennial in 1988 was celebrated worldwide, culminating in an all-star tribute at Carnegie Hall benefitting the Hall and ASCAP, subsequently an Emmy Award winning special on CBS, and featuring such varied luminaries of the musical world as Frank Sinatra, Leonard Bernstein, Isaac Stern, Natalie Cole and Willie Nelson. Irving Berlin died in his sleep in his town house in New York City on September 22, 1989, at the age of 101.



**DAVID IVES** (Book) first came to wide notice in the theatre with his one-act plays, of which he has written over three dozen both for theatre and the radio. The greater part of them are collected in the anthologies All In The Timing (originally an evening of six one-acts that won of the Outer Critics Circle Playwriting Award), Time Flies and The Other Woman and Other Short Plays. He has been included in the Best Short Plays series seven times to date. His full-length plays include Venus In Fur, The Liar (adapted from Corneille's comedy, and winner of the Charles MacArthur Award for "Outstanding New Play"), The Heir Apparent (adapted from

J-F. Regnard's comedy), New Jerusalem: The Interrogation of Baruch de Spinoza (winner of the Hull-Warriner Award), The School for Lies (adapted from Molière's The Misanthrope), Is He Dead? (adapted from Mark Twain), Irving Berlin's White Christmas, Ancient History, Don Juan in Chicago, The Land of Cockaigne and Polish Joke. He has translated Feydeau's A Flea In Her Ear (winner of a Joseph Jefferson Award) as well as Yasmina Reza's A Spanish Play, wrote the libretto of the opera The Secret Garden (with music by Greg Pliska, which premiered at the Pennsylvania Opera Theatre in 1991), and has adapted 32 shows for New York's celebrated Encores! series of American musicals in concert. He is also the author of three young-adult novels: Monsieur Eek, Scrib and Voss. A former Guggenheim Fellow in playwriting and a graduate of Yale School of Drama, he lives in New York City. He is on the Council of the Dramatists Guild of America.



**PAUL BLAKE** (*Book*) served as Executive Producer of the St. Louis Muny for 22 years; with 11,350 seats, the Muny is America's largest theatre. At The Muny where *Irving Berlin's White Christmas* began in Summer 2000 - Blake produced more than 150 productions, which starred such legends as Phyllis Diller, Captain Kangaroo and the Radio City Rockettes. His new musical, *Roman Holiday*, with a score by Cole Porter, had its American premiere at The Guthrie Theatre in Minneapolis this past summer.
